







hairman's Introduction

Introduction

The year 2014 was my second year as Chairperson of Horse Sport Ireland (HSI) and it has been an honour and a pleasure to hold the position. We have a great 32-county industry with a diverse range of stakeholders. It was a year when we identified many of the challenges faced by the sector. For those people serious about getting a financial return for their efforts and achieving good competition results, the quality of the horses and ponies, the competency of the producers and the skills of the riders were issues that arose and will have to be addressed on an ongoing basis. At the top level, we are in a global competition and the type of animals required for the various disciplines is changing and the required skill of the competitor continues to rise.

It is important to be optimistic and positive about our sector but we have to be realistic and recognise where improvements are needed. Constructive criticism is welcome, as there are always better ways to do things, but we need to progress in a climate of mutual respect for all those involved in our sector. Whether you are partaking in breeding horses or in equestrian sport, for business or pleasure, high standards have to be maintained and everyone should strive to do the very best they can within the resources available to them.

I acknowledge the hard work and commitment of the executive staff of HSI and the contribution of my fellow board members and members of the sub-boards and many committees which enable HSI to function. We have an industry driven by passion and enthusiasm, and the armies of volunteers who populate the affiliates, and enable a diverse array of equestrian activities to take place in Ireland every weekend, bear testimony to this.

The performance of our senior riders across several continents continues to make us proud. They are phenomenal ambassadors for our sport and great role models for our young people. We have a steady stream of young riders emerging, which gives us great optimism for the future. I compliment our Chefs d'Equipe, coaches, all the support staff, the many owners and sponsors who pay the bills, and the parents, who play a huge role in enabling our talented young riders realise their full potential. An investment in our young people is an investment in the future and if we are to have a sustainable industry, we need youth and new blood engaged at all levels.

One objective going forward has to be to connect our breeders with the market requirements and provide Irish horse power to the top riders in the various disciplines. However, in addition to horses for international



competitors, horses for the leisure market and for competitive amateurs also have to be fit for purpose. There is no place for breeding poor-quality animals. Money invested in producing such animals is wasted.

I thank those behind the many equestrian centres, events and shows around the country, who provide the opportunity for developing human and equine talent and for supplying great enjoyment and entertainment for many.

A lot of people, both individuals and families, derive great pleasure from their horses and ponies and it is important to recognise the benefits of being involved which are unrelated to monetary gain. The sport transcends all socio-economic groups and fondness of a horse is often a common denominator that initiates many friendships.

Our many affiliates have different aims and objectives and their members have different ambitions and aspirations for themselves and their equines.

Co-operating and working together, we can achieve great things.

CEO Report



Report of the Chief Executive

A lot of Horse Sport Ireland's (HSI) focus in 2014 was taken up with the development of the industry strategic plan. Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Simon Coveney, showed great commitment to developing the plan, including participation in wellattended public consultation meetings. By the end of 2014, a draft of the plan *Reaching New Heights*, had been presented to Minister Coveney. The plan will give us a road map for the development of the sector over the next decade.

Once again in 2014, our young Irish riders distinguished themselves on the world stage. Six European medals were won, including two Team Gold medals. A particularly notable achievement this year was Michael G Duffy's gold medal, as part of the European team at the Youth Olympic Games in Nanjing, China.

Our senior show jumping and eventing teams performed with distinction at the World Equestrian Games (WEG) in Caen, France. Our eventing team finished sixth, to secure Olympic qualification for the Rio 2016 Olympics, while our show jumping team put up a very strong performance to finish in seventh place, narrowly missing out on qualification for Rio. Bertram Allen's win, in the opening competition with Molly Malone V, was a particular highlight of the WEG for Ireland. Outstanding performances from Bertram were a feature of 2014, amongst which was his great win in the Dublin Grand Prix. In time to come, 2014 will be remembered as the year when a young Irish star arrived on the world stage.

The Irish Sport Horse Studbook, once again, topped the world eventing rankings. On the show jumping side our ranking needs to improve. The rankings only take into account the points of the top six horses of each studbook. The horses that determine each studbook's ranking tend to be 10 years of age, or older. Looking at the performances in the World Young Horse Championship, where Irish horses have won medals in the five-year-old category in each of the last two years, there are signs of progress. However, it will take a number of years before improvements will be reflected in the World Breeding Federation of Sports Horses (WBFSH) rankings.

While the industry focused on various breeding

initiatives, the biggest issue for breeding is the number of horses being registered without verified pedigree. All horses registered in the Irish Sport Horse Studbook and the Irish Draught Horse Studbook have had their pedigree verified by DNA. This is crucial in giving increased confidence to the buyers of our horses. Vitally, it allows us to identify the bloodlines that are producing the better horses and those that are not. Registering foals without verified pedigree is damaging our sector. It is something that the whole sector, breeding and sport alike, must do more to address. We need to get to a situation where every sport horse foal born in Ireland is registered in a studbook, with their pedigree verified by DNA.

The number of international events in Ireland grew again in 2014. The Discover Ireland Dublin Horse Show was once again an outstanding success. To hear many visitors deem it the best show in the world is a huge boost for Ireland. Tattersalls International Horse Trials, in association with HSI, continues to grow. It is now one of the top events on the global calendar. A particular highlight for 2014, was the European Pony Championships in Millstreet. The competition was a massive success and brought great credit to Ireland.

HSI now has 27 affiliate bodies. The vast majority of these are now based in the same building in Naas and have their meetings there. This has facilitated enhanced levels of cooperation, which has been of real benefit to the sector. The board of HSI comprises volunteers and they give their time generously. This is also the case with our affiliate bodies. Without this volunteer effort our sector would not function. It is important that those who make their living from the sector acknowledge the important contribution made by volunteers. One such volunteer was former HSI Chairman Joe Walsh, who sadly passed away on 9th November, 2014. Joe made a huge contribution to HSI and it is a pity that he did not get longer to enjoy his retirement. We also lost our long serving Breeding Sub Board member, John Jude Doyle, in 2014. May they rest in peace.

Finally, I want to thank the staff of HSI who give such commitment to the organisation. Most of our staff are accessible in the evenings and at weekends - they are passionate about the sector. As a governing body we have lots of decisions to make. When an organisation is selecting teams, inspecting stallions and allocating funding, amongst other difficult decisions, there will always be those who are successful and those who are not. Sometimes the staff can feel the brunt of people's disappointment. I am very grateful for their commitment to the organisation and the sector.

High Performance Programmes







In 2008. Horse Sport Ireland (HSI) introduced High Performance structures in conjunction with the Irish Sports Council (ISC) and the relevant Affiliate Organisations. The programmes consist of a mix of training and target competitions aimed at preparing combinations for the challenges they are likely to face at European level. Most years Ireland sends seven underage teams abroad to represent us in European Championships (see below). In 2014, Ireland also sent a pony dressage team to the Pony European Dressage Championships and a show jumping rider to the Youth Olympic Games.

These High Performance Programmes are overseen by High Performance Committees. The High Performance team manager has full selection powers. These programmes are funded by the ISC, Showjumping Ireland and Eventing Ireland. The progress made to date brings credit to the riders, their families, their coaches, their owners, the Affiliate Organisations, the High Performance Programmes and the HSI Coaching Programme. Having achieved such excellent results, the challenge now is to help these exceptional young athletes to make the transition to the successful senior teams.

Senior Show Jumping: World Equestrian Games 2014

The Irish show jumping team came tantalisingly close to obtaining automatic qualification for the 2016 Rio Olympics when finishing seventh at the WEG 2014 in Normandy, France.

Ireland's quartet of Darragh Kenny, Bertram Allen, Denis Lynch and Cameron Hanley needed at least a sixth-place finish to ensure qualification. Nevertheless, the top 10 finish at Normandy was one of Ireland's strongest performances in 2014, with just a single fence denying them a qualification place.

Though missing out on team medals, Bertram Allen finished seventh, Denis Lynch ninth and Darragh Kenny 12th in the Individual Finals. A strong performance by the team, who were just one place away from Olympic qualification, having finished seventh of 35 teams, a particular highlight was Bertram Allen's win in the opening speed class on the first day where he beat 152 of the world's top riders.





Horse Sport Ireland Mare Selections

Mare selections for the Irish Sport Horse Studbook and Irish Draught Horse Studbook are carried out at regional venues annually in spring and autumn. Mares must be a minimum of three years of age to be presented for selection, although Irish Draught mares can be presented for selection at two years of age in autumn. Mares undergo a veterinary examination and are assessed on conformation and movement using linear profiling. Movement is assessed in hand and loose in an arena. Owners can choose to have their mare's athleticism assessed through loose jumping for additional merits.

Horse Sport Ireland Stallion Inspections

A total of 25 stallions were presented for inspection during the Horse Sport Ireland Stallion Inspections at Cavan Equestrian Centre on 25th and 26th February 2014. The inspection process involves a veterinary examination (including x-rays) and assessment of conformation, movement and athleticism using linear profiling. Movement is assessed in hand and loose in an arena. Athleticism is assessed through loose jumping and/or jumping under saddle. Irish Draught Horse stallions are also assessed on breed 'type'.



FEI World Breeding Eventing Championships for Young Horses - Le Lion d'Angers

THE FEI World Breeding Eventing Championships for Young Horses take place annually at Le Lion d'Angers, France. These Championships consist of two competitions, a CCI1* for sixyear-olds and a CCI 2* for seven-year-olds. The World Breeding Federation for Sport Horses (WBFSH) competition forms part of this prestigious event, with the winning studbook awarded the World Breeding Trophy for Young Horses. In total, 104 horses are selected by their countries. In 2014, of the 104 horses selected to compete, 18 were Irish sport horses. Eight of these represented Ireland and 10 represented other countries including Austria, France, Great Britain, Italy, New Zealand, Sweden and the US.

Discover Ireland Dublin Horse Show at the RDS

The Discover Ireland Dublin Horse Show is Ireland's biggest equestrian event, and takes place at the RDS in August each year. The show is attended by approximately 100,000 visitors over its five-day duration and includes five-star international show jumping, the centrepiece of which is the Aga Khan Nations Cup. In addition, a huge amount of other international and national show jumping classes take place, as well as showing, eventing and pony classes. Horse Sport Ireland (HSI) supports the three-year-old loose, jumping competition and the four, five and six-year-old national show jumping classes.

Tattersalls International Horse Trials in association with Horse Sport Ireland

Tattersalls International Horse Trials, in association with HSI, are held annually at the Tattersalls sales complex in Ratoath, Co. Meath. Attended by over 20,000 people, the event features a number of classes, at international and national level, and attracts top riders from all over the world to compete. The Irish Sport Horse Studbook is the leading studbook for eventing horses in the world and the HSI Breeding Sub-Board considers it strategically important for Ireland to have a flagship eventing competition in the country.

Badminton International Horse Trials

Badminton International Horse Trials is one of only six four-star events held in the world each year. Badminton takes place in May and is considered to be the world's premier three-day event. It attracts the elite of eventing competitors – both horses and riders. HSI supports Badminton in the form of promotion of the Irish Sport Horse Studbook – the world's leading studbook for eventing horses.

Irish Breeders Classic

The Irish Breeders Classic, which was initiated in 2012, is a show jumping competition for five and six-yearold Irish-born horses with a total prize fund of \notin 50,000, making this competition the one with the richest prize fund in the world. Five per cent of the overall prize fund goes directly to breeders, with breeders' prizes of \notin 3,000 provided by HSI. The prize fund is generated by voluntary contributions from organisations and individuals within the Irish sport horse industry, including HSI.

FEI European Pony Championships at Millstreet

In 2014, Millstreet played host to the European Championships for Ponies. The Cork venue welcomed competitors from throughout Europe in the disciplines of show jumping, eventing and dressage. In total, 17 nations were represented at the Championships, with Ireland securing two medals. HSI supported the European Championships through an international hosting grant, as well as €10,000 in funding from the Breeding Sub-Board.

Connemara Pony Show

The Connemara Pony Breeders Society (CPBS) hosts the Connemara Pony Show, as part of the Connemara Pony Festival, in August each year at the showgrounds in Clifden, Co. Galway. HSI provides financial support to the show each year. The show includes loose jumping, in-hand classes, ridden classes and working hunter classes.

Irish Farriery Authority

The Irish Farriery Authority is the umbrella body for farriery in Ireland. It is responsible for providing farriery training in Ireland and maintaining a database of practising farriers. HSI provides annual funding towards the organisation's activities.

In January 2014, the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Simon Coveney, launched a strategic planning process for Ireland's sport horse sector. The strategy development was undertaken by Horse Sport Ireland (HSI), Teagasc and the Royal Dublin Society (RDS), with an emphasis on export-led growth and increasing employment in the sector. The process was overseen by a Steering Group chaired by Prof. Patrick Gibbons, Professor of Strategic Management, UCD Smurfit Business School.

To aid the development of this strategy, the Irish Sport Horse Industry Strategy Committee held regional meetings for all those involved in the industry. The objective of these meetings was to seek input from those involved at various levels of the industry to deal with challenges facing the sector. The regional meetings were held at four venues in March and April in 2014 (Meath, Kilkenny, Cork and Galway) and in June in Northern Ireland.

A draft document was presented to Minister Simon Coveney on 16th December 2014, entitled *Reaching New Heights – Report of the Irish Sport Horse Strategy Committee.*

The Irish Horse Gateway (IHG) is an initiative that connects the world to the Irish horse and pony. Launched by Horse Sport Ireland (HSI) in May 2013, this sales channel for sellers of Irish-bred horses and ponies began operating commercially in September 2013. The aims of the initiative are to: help breeders and producers in Ireland to sell high quality, Irish-bred horses and ponies in international markets; to give foreign buyers increased confidence in buying horses and ponies in Ireland; to assist foreign buyers in sourcing reputable providers of other services; and to provide market feedback to Irish breeders and producers

Annual Report 2014



In September 2014, the IHG received a request from an Omani buyer who was interested in sourcing three horses suitable as 'all-rounders' for use at Creo Equestrian Centre in Oman. After discussion with an IHG representative, the buyer, Khalil Salim Al Obaidani, and his trainer, Said Ali Salim Al Hashimi, travelled to Ireland to view a selection of horses.

Three Irish-bred mares were selected by the Omani buyers and the IHG structured the contract for the sale of the horses on behalf of the sellers and the buyers, as well as assisting with arrangements for shipping the horses to Oman.

- Larry Costello, Kilkenny (Goodwins Malteaser)
- Chris Ronan, Kildare (Meadowstream Maggie May)
- Margaret McCabe, Wexford (Gale Bust)

The Middle East region is an emerging market for Irish horses. Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Simon Coveney, lead a trade mission and visited the region in October 2013. Part of that trade mission was the promotion of Irish horses and to develop equine business relations with Ireland.

Trade mission to China

Horse Sport Ireland (HSI) was represented at the 8th China Horse Fair, held in Beijing, China from 22nd to 24th October 2014. Enterprise Ireland organised a trade stand at the Fair which included HSI, Horseware, Irish Thoroughbred Marketing, Redmills, The Irish Equine Centre and Mervue Laboratories. Teagasc was also represented there. The quarantine protocols agreed be<mark>tween the Irish</mark> and Chinese governments now allow for Irish horses to complete 30 days' quarantine in Ireland (Monasterevin) before departing to China where they undergo a further 30 days in guarantine. Previously, Irish sellers had to guarantine horses in the Netherlands. There is strong market potential for coaching and education. Former Irish international riders Sue Short (eventing) and Jack Doyle (show jumping) attended the Fair. Both Susan and Jack have trained provincial and regional teams in China. The potential is strong for Irish trainers to educate riders and provide high performance training in China



HSI Coaching Programme

The Horse Sport Ireland (HSI) Coaching Programme is designed to provide candidates with a pathway to a career as a successful competition coach. HSI coaching courses are delivered by professional equestrian tutors and use modern techniques to improve both horses' and riders' performance. Coaching courses are currently delivered across four levels and are accredited by Coaching Ireland, the Irish governing body for coaching in all sports.

The HSI coaching system is a competition-based coaching system and focuses solely on coaching. The courses offer a better understanding of modern competition requirements, coaching skills, technical knowledge and principles of good communications, so they are also suitable for parents, breeders, young horse producers, competitors, riding school instructors and anyone involved with – or with an interest in – horses and the industry.

Since the HSI Coaching Programme has been operational, it has delivered hundreds of courses all around Ireland and further afield. The HSI Coaching System has been adopted by the British Equestrian Federation (BEF) and the Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI). A very successful year for HSI Coaching, 2014 saw more than 320 applicants taking part in coaching courses around the country.

FEI Clean Sport

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) carries out testing on horses at international competitions. Ireland is placed in Group I and II for the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Programme (EADCMP). In 2014, a total of 4,752 horses were tested worldwide and 3,492 of those were tested within Group I and II. One hundred and sixteen of those tested from Group I and II were horses and ponies ridden by Irish riders in international competitions. All of the samples taken were found to be clean when tested in the FEI laboratories. No horse ridden by an Irish rider has tested positive in a FEI competition since 2008.

Directors' report

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2014.

Principal activities and business review

The principal activity of Horse Sport Ireland (HSI) is to promote the sport horse sector in Ireland and to co-ordinate the breeding, sport and leisure aspects of the industry. 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles under the historic cost convention and comply with the financial reporting standards of the Financial Reporting Council, as promulgated by the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Ireland, and Irish statute comprising the Companies Act 2014.

1.2 Turnover income

Income includes grant amounts received from the Irish Sports Council and Sport NI, and from the Department of Agriculture grant funds and income received from registrations and related activities. Income also includes grants receivable.

1.3 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Leasehold property	-	25% Straight Line
Fixtures and fittings	-	25% & 20% Straight Line
Equipment	-	25% & 20% Straight Line

1.4 Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are shown at cost less provision for impairment.

1.5 Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow-moving stocks. Cost includes all direct costs and an appropriate proportion of fixed and variable overheads.

1.6 Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

Benefits received and receivable as an incentive to sign an operating lease are recognised on a straight line basis over the period until the date the rent is expected to be adjusted to the prevailing market rate.

1. Accounting policies (continued)

1.7 Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into euro at rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date.

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into euro at the rate ruling on the date of the transaction.

Exchange gains and losses are recognised in the profit and loss account.

1.8 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme and the assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company in an independently administered fund. The pension cost charge represents contributions payable by the company to the fund, and amounted to &85,909 (2013 - &85,473).






Horse Sport Ireland Sources of Income 2014






Horse Sport Ireland High Performance Investment Allocations 2014
