Just months after it burst onto the Irish sporting calendar with three stunning nights of entertainment during June 2015, Jumping In The City won the "Best Innovation in Sport" award at the Sport Industry Awards organised by the Federation of Irish Sport.

One of three shortlisted, the Jumping In The City initiative that saw top level Show Jumping take place in Irish greyhound stadia during the summer, took the winner's trophy at the ceremony held in the Smock Alley Theatre, Dublin.

The award, sponsored by The Sunday Business Post, was given to Jumping In The City under various criteria, including "seizing an opportunity to create a new market or industry", creating an "effective communication strategy around the innovation", and producing "an immediate and likely longer term impact on sport".

Jumping In The City saw large crowds flock to see top international riders and horses compete during the month of June, 2015, at Limerick and Cork greyhound stadia, with the final held in Shelbourne Park, Dublin.

Revenue from the initiative also helped support Special Olympics Ireland Equestrian Athletes travelling to represent Ireland at the World Summer Games 2015.

Jumping In The City was launched by Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Simon Coveney TD at an event in Shelbourne Park in April 2015.

FURUSIYYA NATIONS CUP REVIEW 2016

Horse Sport Ireland Show Jumping Team Manager Robert Splaine can look back on the 2016 Nations Cup campaign with huge satisfaction, recording one win and two runner-up finishes on the way to the ultimate goal of qualification for the final in Barcelona.

The season began in unusual fashion when Ireland's first points-scoring round scheduled for Lummen in Belgium, was cancelled due to torrential rain.

This put pressure on Ireland for a good result when they travelled to St Gallen in Switzerland. The Irish produced a stunning performance to win a closefought contest with Tipperary's Greg Broderick the star performer with The Irish Sport Horse, MHS Going Global. Ireland held joint second place at the halfway stage thanks to Broderick's clear round along with four fault scores from Denis Lynch with All Star 5 and Cian O'Connor riding Good Luck.

Three second round clears in-a-row from Broderick, Bertram Allen riding Molly Malone and O'Connor, saw Ireland lift the trophy on a total of eight faults, with Sweden, France, Germany and The United States tied for second.

Ireland then travelled to Falsterbo in Sweden where Robert Splaine selected Shane Sweetnam (Chaqui Z), Darragh Kenny (Go Easy De Muze), Anthony Condon (Aristio) and Shane Breen (Golden Hawk). Condon and Aristio were the stand-out combination jumping a double clear round as Ireland finished in joint sixth place.













FURUSIYYA NATIONS CUP REVIEW 2016

The stage was set for Ireland's final points scoring round on home soil in Dublin where the famous Aga Khan trophy was up for grabs. Another brilliant performance from the boys in green saw them finish two rounds of jumping on a zero score, taking runnerup spot after a tense jump-off against an inspired Italian side.

A thrilling afternoon of action saw Greg Broderick with The Irish Sport Horse MHS Going Global and Cian O'Connor with the stallion Good Luck, both jump perfect double clear rounds. Denis Lynch also never touched a pole over the two rounds of jumping, adding just a time fault second time out, while Bertram Allen also delivered a clear second round with the stallion Hector van d'Abdijhoeve.

Both countries then had to nominate one rider each for a third round jump-off against the clock, where speed specialist Piergiorgio Buicci came out on top against Denis Lynch to give Italy their first Aga Khan victory since 2009.

Hickstead hosted the last round of the 2016 series, where for the second week running Ireland finished as runners-up. Bertram Allen (Molly Malone), Billy Twomey (Diaghilev), Anthony Condon (Aristio) and Shane Breen (Golden Hawk), ended on eight faults to tie for second with Belgium, while Germany scooped the winner's trophy.

The result saw Ireland finish the season in second place on the league table, comfortably taking one of the coveted places on offer for the Furusiyya Nations Cup final at Barcelona in September and also confirms Ireland's position among the top tier of world Show Jumping again for 2017. Britain were surprisingly relegated along with Belgium and Czech Republic.

- A fall by either horse or rider will mean immediate elimination
- Height of fences not over 1.10m or 3ft 6inches
- Amateur riders are defined as riders who do not compete at fence heights above 1.20m and they do not compete for prize money instead prizes-inkind are awarded

- Two round competition
- Height of fences 1.50m (almost 5 feet)
- Number of competitors 16
- First round four faults are awarded for each fence knocked.
- Time allowed the course builder will announce the time allowed for riders to complete the course before the competition begins. If a competitor

exceeds the time allowed, 1 penalty will be awarded for every four seconds commenced over the time allowed.

- All of the first round clears will go through to the second round.

- Puissance A high-jump competition, where the final wall may reach over seven feet tall.
- The word "Puissance" is the Anglo-French word for "power".
- The world record for Puissance is held by German rider Franke Sloothaak, who in June 1991 jumped 7ft 10ins (2.40m) in Chaudfontaine, Belgium on Optiebeurs Golo, breaking his previous record set on Leonardo.

rounds - opening round followed by four jumpoffs, not against the clock. The first round consists of four to six large single obstacles including the puissance wall. For the jump-offs, in which the fences are raised for each round, there are only two obstacles—a spread fence and the wall. In the event of equality after the fifth round, riders share first prize

- The winners are the horse(s) & rider(s) who jump the highest
- · The competition involves a maximum of five

Show Jumping Terminology

- Vertical (or upright) a jump that consists of poles or planks placed one directly above another with no spread, or width, to jump
- **Oxer** two verticals close together, to make the jump wider, also called a spread
- **Triple bar** is a spread fence using three elements of graduating heights
- Wall this type of jump usually is made to resemble a brick wall, but the "bricks" are constructed of a lightweight material and fall easily when knocked
- Combination usually two or three jumps in a row, with no more than two strides between each; two jumps in a row are called double combinations, and three jumps in a row are called triple combinations (if a horse refuses the second

or third element in one of these combinations, they must jump the whole combination again, not just any obstacle missed)

- Water fence an obstacle with a tray or ditch filled with water, with a take-off and landing point.
 If a horse puts a foot in the water, or lands on the tape at landing point - four faults are awarded.
- Stride each time a horses four feet leave the ground and land again is called a stride. The length of a horses stride is approximately four yards. Riders will measure the distance between fences during the course walk using four of their own steps as a guide to each stride.
- **Scope** the ability shown by a horse to jump. A horse that looks to have a big jump is often referred to as having "lots of scope"

THE LUCKY SEVEN! - Ireland will be represented by seven Equestrian athletes in Rio – four Eventing riders, one Show Jumper, one Dressage rider and a Paralympic rider. Equestrian sports at the Olympics represents one of Ireland's best medal hopes

The 2016 Summer Olympics at Rio De Janerio in Brazil will see a record number of countries participating in a record number of sports

Over 10,500 athletes from 206 countries will take compete across 42 different disciplines

Ireland will send its largest team since 1948, with 77 athletes in total taking part, a large portion of which will be fulfilling a lifelong ambition to become Olympians for the every first time

For Equestrian sports the Olympic Games provide a unique platform to showcase to the world the unique bond between horse and rider. Equestrian is the ONLY Olympic sport where men and women compete head-to-head on an equal footing and for the same medals

Equestrian has been in the Olympic movement for 104 years, celebrating its centenary at London 2012

A record number of 43 nations are competing in Equestrian at the Rio 2016 Olympic Games

Five National Olympic Committees will be sending equestrian athletes to an Olympic Games for the first time at Rio - Chinese Taipei and Qatar for Jumping, the Dominican Republic and Palestine for Dressage, and Zimbabwe for Eventing

The Olympic Equestrian Centre in Deodoro Olympic Park was originally built for the 2007 Pan-American Games

Equestrian competition at the Rio Olympic Games starts on August 6th , with the first day of Eventing - preceded on 5 August by the first horse inspection - and ends on August 19 when individual Jumping medals are awarded

The Deodoro venue is 18 miles north-west of central Rio and is home to Brazil's largest military barracks, catering for more than 60,000 servicemen and women

2016 host nation Brazil has won three Olympic equestrian medals, all in Jumping: team bronze in 1996 and 2000, 2004 and individual gold for Rodrigo Pessoa in 2004

Ireland won Olympic medals in two sports at London 2012, Boxing and Equestrian



Equestrian Olympic History

1900: Equestrian sport featured on Olympic programme for first time at the Paris Olympic Games, covering five competitions - grand prix jumping, high jump, long jump, Hacks and Hunter Combined and Mail Coach

1912: Equestrian sport returned to Olympic Games at Stockholm following a 12-year gap after the IOC Congress supported moves to introduce Dressage, Eventing and Jumping. Equestrian in this format has been a core sport at the Olympics ever since

1936: Austria's Arthur von Pongracz becomes the oldest Olympic equestrian competitor, aged 72. Germany win all team and individual gold medals in the three disciplines

1952: Entries opened up to all men - previously only commissioned military officers were eligible - while women are allowed to compete in Dressage, extending to Jumping (1956) and Eventing (1964). Danish dressage rider Lis Hartel becomes the first female Olympic medallist winning individual silver with Jubilee

1956: Due to Australian quarantine laws, the Melbourne Olympic Equestrian events are held in Sweden

1960: German Dressage rider Reiner Klimke wins the first of a record six Olympic gold medals

1964: American Lana du Pont becomes the first woman to compete in an Olympic Eventing competition

1968: Tommy Brennan becomes the first Irishman to be selected to compete in two disciplines at one Olympic Games, when he was named for both the Jumping and Eventing teams travelling to Mexico. Sadly, one month before the Games, his Jumping horse Tubber Mac broke a leg in a fall at the water at the Dublin Horse Show. Unbelievably, water played a major role in the Cross Country at Mexico too, with torrential rain causing the river at the second last fence to burst its banks. Brennan and his horse March Hawk bravely jumped in but were swept downstream in the raging torrent. The horse could swim, but Brennan couldn't and he only survived by clinging onto the saddle until he was hauled out of the water by the then FEI President, HRH Prince Phillip.

1972: British Dressage rider Lorna Johnstone becomes the oldest female Olympic equestrian athlete, aged 70, while Germany's Liselott Linsenhoff becomes the first woman to win an Olympic equestrian gold medal, winning gold with Piaff

1976: Britain's Princess Anne, competes in Eventing at the Montreal Olympic Games, finishing 24th

1988: Germany wins Dressage, Eventing and Jumping team gold medals - the first clean sweep since 1936

2008: Beijing hosts the 2008 Olympic Games, with the Equestrian events taking place in Hong Kong due to quarantine restrictions.

2012: Canadian Jumping athlete Ian Millar makes a record 10th Olympic appearance; Ireland's Cian O'Connor and Blue Lloyd win Show Jumping Olympic Bronze.

2016: Five countries will make their Olympic equestrian debuts in Rio - Qatar and Chinese Taipei (Jumping), Dominican Republic and Palestine (Dressage) and Zimbabwe (Eventing)

IRELAND will field a full team of four Eventing riders in Rio, following successful qualification at the 2014 World Equestrian Games in France

Olympic Eventing is run over three phases, effectively an equestrian triathlon, with Dressage, Cross Country and Show Jumping in that order

24 nations will take part in the Olympic Eventing competition, 2 more than in 2012

Ireland is one of 14 Nations that have qualified full teams. They will be joined by: Australia, Brazil, Canada, France, Germany, Great Britain, Italy, Netherlands, New Zealand, Russia, Sweden, Switzerland, United States

Teams can be either three or four horse/rider combinations, with the three best individual results after all three phases added together to give team scores

The top 25 horse and rider combinations after the completion of the team competition go forward to another Jumping round to decide the individual medals.

The first round of the individual final is open to the top 35 horse/rider combinations after the first three days of competition. All participants start the individual final A on zero (0) penalties. The top 20 from this round then go through to the final round B to decide the individual medals, with the horse/rider on the lowest score winning gold

The faults for individual final round A and B and added together to determine individual medals. In the case of equality of faults after round A & B a jump-off will take place.

Facts & Figures

The Jumping competitions at the Rio 2016 Olympic Games will be staged at the Deodoro Olympic Equestrian Venue.

Riders from 27 nations will take part in the Show Jumping competitions in Rio – one more than in 2012.

Chinese Taipei and Qatar will make their Olympic Equestrian debut

As with each of the Olympic Equestrian disciplines,

men and women compete against each other for the same set of medals – unique in the Olympic Movement

Germany hold the Olympic Jumping record of eight team titles.

The first Olympic team Jumping champions were Sweden in 1912

Only the top 18 individuals following the Grand Prix Special go forward to the Grand Prix Freestyle to Music to compete for individual medals

RECORD-BREAKERS – London 2012 Olympic champions Charlotte Dujardin and Valegro (GBR) were the first partnership ever to score over 90% at an Olympic Games, with an Olympic record score of 90.089% in the Freestyle to Music

First timers Dominican Republic and Palestine are sending their first Equestrian athletes to an Olympic Games, and will be competing in Individual Dressage

JUDGES - Olympic Dressage competitions have seven judges spaced around the arena for optimal viewing **MARKS** are awarded for each movement during the test and range from a perfect 10 for excellent, to 0 when the required movement is not executed. The scores from each of the seven judges are added together and the final mark is given as a percentage, with the highest percentage being the winner

MEDALS – there are two sets of medals on offer – Team and Individual

Judy Reynolds is 35-years-old from Kildare. She competed at the 2016 World Cup Final, Göteborg, Sweden. Previously she competed at the 2014 World Equestrian Games, Caen, France; 2010 World Equestrian Games, Lexington Kentucky, USA and 2006 World Equestrian Games, Aachen, Germany. Judy holds the Irish record score for both the Grand Prix and Freestyle to Music at International level. The Grand Prix record of 75.24% was set at the four-star Grand Prix at Achleiten in Austria in June 2016. The Freestyle to music record of 79.70% was set at the five-star show at Doha, Qatar in March 2016.

Judy will ride **Vancouver K**, a 14-year-old bay gelding by Jazz out of Phantastia by Ferro. Bred by G.M. Korver-Harmelen (NED) and owned by Joe & Kathleen Reynolds

RIO 2016 PARALYMPICS



The Equestrian events at the Paralympic Games take place in Rio from September 11th- 16th

The Aim: The rider must prompt the horse to perform compulsory movements, freestyle routines are choreographed to music.

Ireland has one Individual place qualified

Equestrian at the 2016 Summer Paralympics consists of 11 dressage events, 10 for individual riders across five classes, and a single mixed team, mixed category event

Riders are given a classification depending on the type and extent of their disability

The classification system allows riders to compete against others with a similar level of function

Athletes are classified according to their functional ability when mounted across four grades and five categories

The individual athlete will compete in two Dressage tests. The combination of both these scores will determine whether the athlete will progress to the final individual Freestyle test

The individual Freestyle competition is only open to the best one third horse and rider combinations based on their scores from the first two Dressage tests

The individual Freestyle test will determine the medals for the Freestyle championship

Each Dressage movement is marked out of 10

The score is then calculated into a percentage. Highest percentage wins

RIO 2016 PARALYMPICS COMBINATION





Helen Kearney is 27 years-old from Dunlavin Co Wicklow. She won three medals at the London 2012 Paralympics, individually a silver and bronze and also helped the Irish team to secure team bronze. In 2011 she claimed Ireland's first European Para Equestrian medal, winning bronze in the Grade 1a Individual Test at Moorsele in Belgium. Helen finished fifth in both the individual and Freestyle test at the 2014 World Equestrian Games in Normandy, France.

Helen will ride **Rock and Roll 2**, a 12-year-old black gelding by the sire Romancero H out of the dam Anna and owned by the Kearney family

As we witness a fantastic night here at Shelbourne Park for Jumping In The City, just seven days ago four Irish Young Riders made history in Millstreet Co Cork, when they were crowned Under 21 European Champions, winning the Team Gold Medal.

Mayo's Michael G Duffy, Dublin's Matt Garrigan, Gavin Harley from Donegal and Wicklow's Max O'Reilly Hyland, produced a phenomenal performance to land Ireland's very first Young Rider Team Gold, under the guidance of Chef d'Equipe, Comdt. John Ledingham.

Ireland were tied for the lead with Belgium on a zero

score at the halfway stage following clear rounds from Duffy riding Felix, Garrigan with Contino and O'Reilly Hyland with Ahmed Du Calvaire. The second round saw Ireland add just five faults to their total. Duffy came home with just a time fault, while Garrigan lowered a single fence. Ireland's last rider, Gavin Harley with Understone Van de Kapel, delivered a perfect clear to seal the gold medal for Ireland. The Netherlands took the Silver medal with Switzerland claiming Bronze.
