SECTION II ELIGIBILITY FOR SELECTION

- 2.1 All athletes and horses wishing to compete at the <u>CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S</u> must be mindful of the following eligibility requirements:
 - 2.1.1 An Athlete may compete as a Young Rider from the beginning of the calendar year in which he reaches the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which he reaches the age of 21.
 - 2.1.2 An Athlete may compete as a Junior from the beginning of the calendar year in which he reaches the age of 14 until the end of the year in which he reaches the age of 18.
 - 2.1.3 An Athlete may compete in the Children's category from the beginning of the calendar year in which he reaches the age of 12 until the end of the calendar year in which he reaches the age of 14.
 - 2.1.4 All athletes must be registered as IRL athletes for 2018, notwithstanding Art. 119.3.1 of the FEI General Regulations, 2018 which states that a 'A minor athlete who is a citizen of more than one country can choose each calendar year in which he wishes to represent'. Please note an Athlete under 18 years of age is defined as a Minor Athlete. (Art.118.4 GR's)
- 2.2 All athletes and horses wishing to compete at the CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S Fontainebleau, (FRA) must in the first instance achieve a Minimum Eligibility Requirement (MER) in accordance with FEI Jumping Rules, 2018.
- 2.3 Athletes should note the FEI timeline for Athletes and Horses to achieve the FEI minimum

- eligibility criteria is from 1 January 2017 through to 10 June 2018, with Certificates of Capability to be submitted to the FEI by 11 June 2018.
- 2.4 It is the sole responsibility of each Athlete, their person responsible and/or their personal management team to ensure that the athlete/horse combination has the required MER for the level of the Championship. In this case the MER for the CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S Fontainebleau, (FRA), please note the following FEI Qualification Criteria Published on 21 December 2017, updated on 16 April 2018 (Version V)
- 2.5 Thereafter, Athletes, their person responsible and/or their personal management team should be mindful that the MER as stated above, is only a MINIMUM requirement.
- Athletes must be jumping competently at a height comparable to what is expected at CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S level.
- 2.7 Athletes, their person responsible and/or their personal management team should familiarise themselves with the most up to date information from the FEI with regard to the CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S.

SECTION III RESPONSIBILITES

- 3.1 It is the sole responsibility of each Athlete, their Person Responsible and/or their Personal Management Team to be fully cognisant of the current <u>FEI Rules for Jumping</u>, specifically Annex IX for Young Riders, Juniors and Annex XII for Children and the <u>FEI Clean Sport policy</u>.
- 3.2 It is the responsibility of each Athlete, their person responsible and/or their personal management team to be fully cognisant of the FEI Veterinary Regulations.
- 3.3 Athletes must strictly abide by the principles of the following:
 - i. FEI General Regulations;
 - ii. FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse;
 - iii. HSI & FEI Equine Anti-Doping Rules and Equine Controlled

 Medication Rules and the Human Anti-Doping Rules as set out by
 the FEI and Sport Ireland;
 - iv. Horse Sport Ireland General Rules and Policies;
 - v. The Horse Sport Ireland 'Athlete Code of Conduct' and act in a manner that does not bring Team Ireland Equestrian into disrepute, please see **Appendix 1** attached;
 - vi. The Horse Sport Ireland 'Social Media Policy', please see **Appendix 2** attached;
- 3.4 Prompt communications with the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager, Team Veterinarian and Horse Sport Ireland in relation to the HSI YR/J/Coh Jumping High Performance Programme are required throughout the season.
- 3.5 Athletes must show a commitment to personal fitness and professional behaviour.
- 3.6 All Athletes selected will be required to wear the official HSI Team Ireland Equestrian kit while participating at the CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S Fontainebleau, (FRA).
- 3.7 One of the goals of the Horse Sport Ireland YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Programme is to build a good team spirit within the squad. If an Athlete, their person responsible and/or their personal management team are not contributing to this, the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Manager reserves the right to remove that combination from the squad with immediate effect.
- 3.8 The specific aim of this Policy is to select a team(s) capable of achieving a medal at the FEI CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S European Championships.

SECTION IV VETERINARY

4.1 The YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager and/or Horse Sport Ireland can request that a horse be made available for inspection by the Team Veterinarian(s) or an appointed Veterinarian at any time. Athletes must comply with this request.

- 4.2 Athletes must notify the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager of any change in their horse's health status or of any veterinary issues when they first become apparent.
- 4.3 The YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager and/or Horse Sport Ireland can send the Team Veterinarian or an appointed Veterinarian to take a blood and/or urine sample from a horse at any time, for the purposes of testing for prohibited substances, and/or as part of an assessment of the horse's well-being.
- 4.4 Athletes (at their own expense), shall make available, upon the request of the Team Veterinarian or an appointed Veterinarian, the veterinary records of horse(s) being considered for selection. In addition, athletes, (at their own expense), shall be responsible for supplying any follow-up diagnostic information requested by the Team Veterinarian for horses being considered for selection. Failure to comply with any request of the Team Veterinarian or an appointed Veterinarian may result in the removal of the athlete/horse combination from selection by the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager.
- 4.5 Each athlete will be required to keep a medication log book for their horses in which they shall record all products, treatments, foodstuffs and supplements used on or given to their horse from **11 June 2018** until the conclusion of the FEI CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S European Championships.
- The Team Veterinarian will be entitled to view this log book at any time. Athletes are required to submit this log book (in strict confidence) together with the Medication and Anti-Doping Control Declaration (Appendix 3) to the Team Veterinarian for assessment on or before the FEI Final Definite Entries 26 June 2018 in line with Rule 8.12 of the Horse Sport Ireland General Rules.
- 4.7 In the event that treatments and medications are necessary **subsequent** to the submission of the log book, express approval is required from Team Veterinarian and the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager. This is a **mandatory requirement**_to ensure that squad horses are managed appropriately within the precompetition window and before departure.
- 4.9 For the purposes of section IV, the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager reserves his right to remove an athlete combination from selection, where the athlete does not comply with any of the above veterinary requests or the horse is deemed unsound and/or unfit by the Team Veterinarian to travel and compete at the FEI CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S European Championships. The decision of the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager on advice from Team Veterinarian is final.

SECTION V SPECIFIC SELECTION CRITERIA

- 5.1 The primary aim of this criteria is to select athlete and horse combination (s) to represent Ireland who will deliver the best possible team result at the FEI CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S European Championships.
- 5.2 The following factors will be taken into consideration:
 - 5.2.1 Present form of the horse and athlete up to the date of selection;
 - 5.2.2 Past performance (s) of the horse and athlete;
 - 5.2.3 The performance of combinations at the identified key events listed below at 5.3 & 5.4;
 - 5.2.4 The soundness of the horse to meet the challenges of competing at the FEI CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S European Championships.
 - 5.2.5 Commitment to the HSI High Performance YR/J/Coh Jumping Programme;
 - 5.2.6 Athlete combinations exhibiting a standard comparable to the level and duration of competition at the FEI CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-U-Ch-S Fontainebleau (FRA).

5.3 Children on Horses 2018 – identified key events

5.3.1 Connolly's RED MILLS Spring Tour 2018

Spring Tours – COH expected to compete in the 1m 20 classes which start in February and finish March 2018. - 5.3.3 The YR/J/Coh Jumping High Performance Team Manager will consider performances completed by Children athletes at the designated Nations Cup events listed at 5.4.1 below.
- 5.3.4 The YR/J/Coh Jumping High Performance Team Manager will consider performances completed by Children athletes at 1.20m and 1.30 national level.

The YR/J/Coh Jumping High Performance Team Manager will consider performances completed by Junior & Young Rider athletes at any of the venues designated as part of the League.

The YR/J/Coh Jumping High Performance Team Manager will consider performances completed by Young Rider athletes at any of the venues designated as RDS Young Riders & COH Qualifiers 2018.

5.5.5 FEI CSI Jumping Events

The YR/J/Coh Jumping High Performance Team Manager will consider performances completed by Young Rider & Junior athletes at any of the FEI designated CSI Jumping Events in 2018.

- 5.5 Notwithstanding Art. 5.2 above, the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager reserves his right to consider the exceptional ability of a new Combination(s) (and the potential to achieve a team medal) and may, in the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager 's sole discretion, place such a Combination with less ring time ahead of any another Combination;
- In assessing the performances of combinations the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager will consider the following competition measures:
 - i. The consistency of results across competition types;
 - The final placing of the Combination (note that the score and the placing of each Combination at particular events will be considered but do not automatically position one Combination above another for selection purposes)
- 5.7 In assessing the performance of combinations, the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager may give consideration to the following general measures. These general measures include, but are not limited to:
 - i. An athlete's form on other horses may also be taken in to consideration;
 - ii. the suitability of the Combination with regard to the likely characteristics of the arenas in FEI CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S Fontainebleau (FRA) and for the unexpected

- conditions of the FEI CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S (taking into account the objective of the team and individual competition);
- the ability of the Athlete and his/her support team to operate and perform in a FEI championship environment which is highly regulated & pressurised;
- iv. the ability of the Athlete and/or support team to contribute towards an effective team and winning orientated environment;
- v. the overall balance of the Combinations that have been selected;
- vi. the ability and experience of the Combination to compete successfully at the highest level of international competition;
- vii. demonstrated experience and/ or success at Championship level; the ability, or potential ability, of a Horse and/or Athlete to perform under the stress and pressure of a FEI Championships;
- viii. the ability of the Athlete, and/or their personal management team to prepare their Horse to peak condition for a major campaign, such as the FEI Championship;
- ix. consistency of performance and the likelihood of a suitable performance to contribute towards a team medal outcome may be a consideration;
- 5.8 The YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager will consider section 5.2.5 in the following guise:
 - i. Success individually, and as a Team Ireland Member;
 - ii. Personal bests at targeted competitions;
 - iii. Taking ownership of their performances;
 - iv. Being willing to make change and develop;
 - v. Commitment to team and to drive best team culture;
 - vi. Have personal coaches, individual performance plans, personal fitness structures and horse management programmes in place;
- The soundness of the horse to meet the challenges of competing and travelling to the FEI CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S Fontainebleau (FRA) will be a significant factor in any selection decision. Athletes must keep the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager fully briefed on any health or soundness issues the horse may have both historically and throughout the selection period. From the date of selection, all squad members must immediately inform the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager and Team Veterinarian(s) of any illness or injury (however minor). Where it becomes apparent that a squad horse is unsound, and/or that there was a non-disclosure relating to soundness, the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager reserves the right to remove that combination from the squad with immediate effect. The decision of the Senior High Performance Director on advice from the Team Veterinarian is final.
- Prior and subsequent to selection, the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager may undertake regular evaluations as to the combinations standard of fitness, their progress in training, their preparedness for the event and their form. Any advices provided by the Team Veterinarian and medical professionals may be utilised by the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager, where required. However, such evaluations shall be discretionary on the part of the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager.

5.11 Furthermore, the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager shall have the authority to remove a selected horse/athlete combination from the squad or as a reserve, where the selected horse and/or athlete has not maintained their fitness, standard of performance, or any other performance related matter in which the Manager considers important, which is not a standard comparable to that exhibited so as to gain selection to represent Ireland at the FEI CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S Fontainebleau (FRA).

SECTION VI FORCE MAJEURE

- 6.1 In considering the performances of athletes at events or other attendances in line with this policy, the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager may, at his discretion, give weight to extenuating circumstances.
- 6.2 For the purposes of section 6.1 above, extenuating circumstances means an inability to compete, or perform at an optimum level arising from:
 - i. Injury or illness;
 - ii. Bereavement or personal misfortune, and/or;
 - iii. Any other factors reasonably considered by the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager to constitute extenuating circumstances;
- 6.3 Athletes unable to compete at camps, events, trials or other attendances required under this policy must advise the YR/J/Coh Jumping High Performance Team Manager by email of this fact and the reasons thereof as soon as practicable after the extenuating circumstances arise.
- In the case of injury or illness, athletes may be required to undergo a medical examination by a doctor or doctor (s) nominated by Horse Sport Ireland. The YR/J/Coho Jumping High Performance Team Manager reserves his right to remove an athlete where the designated medical officer deems the athlete unfit to compete, at the level which resulted in their selection for FEI CH-EU-Y-S CH-EU-J-S CH-EU-Ch-S Fontainebleau (FRA).
- A decision in each case of extenuating circumstances will be made by the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager on a case by case basis.

SECTION VII REMOVAL OF ATHLETES

- 7.1 An athlete shall be removed from squad selection (individual or team) non-travelling reserve selection, FEI Nominated Entries and/or FEI Final Entries by the YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager pursuant clause 3.7, 4.9, 5.9, 5.11 & 6.4 above;
- 7.2 An athlete may be removed from squad shortlisting & selection (individual or team), non- travelling reserve selection, FEI Nominated Entries and/or FEI Final Entries for any of the following reasons, as determined by Horse Sport Ireland Sport Panel;
 - Notification of an adverse analytical finding following on from testing pursuant to the FEI & HSI Equine Anti-Doping Rules and Equine Controlled Medication Rules & FEI & Sport Ireland Human Anti-Doping Protocols;
 - Violation of the FEI & HSI Equine Anti-Doping Rules and Equine Controlled Medication Rules & FEI & Sport Ireland Human Anti-Doping Protocols;
 - iii. Violation of the FEI Hypersensitivity Protocol;
 - iv. Violation or alleged violation of the FEI Sport Rules and Regulations, HSI General Rules and/or Policies;
 - v. Violation or alleged violation of the HSI Code of Conduct;
 - vi. Any action which could damage the reputation of the Sport or the Country;

- 7.3 The YR/J/CoH Jumping High Performance Team Manager reserves the right to refer any matter outlined in 7.2 above to the Horse Sport Ireland Sport Panel for determination.
- 7.4 A decision of the Horse Sport Ireland Sport Panel is final and binding.

SECTION VIII DISCLAIMERS

- 8.1 These procedures are based on FEI General Regulations and applicable FEI Sport Rules as presently known and understood. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to HSI. However, the selections are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency.
- As such, this policy can be amended at any time by Horse Sport Ireland. Horse Sport Ireland reserves the right to amend or change the Selection Policy where necessary at any time in order to fulfil the objective of the Selection Policy. In the event, that Horse Sport Ireland is of the opinion that such an amendment is necessary as a result of any change in any of the above stated rules, regulations and agreements, to give effect to the policy following discovery of a drafting error or oversight or for any other reason determined to be in the best interests of Horse Sport Ireland. Horse Sport Ireland shall not be responsible or liable in any way to anyone as a result of any such amendment.
