

Embyro Transfer Scheme for High Performance Mares

The Embyro Transfer Scheme will aim to increase genetic improvement by maximising the genetic potential of Ireland's top class performance mares.

- Mares must be 3 years old or older.
- · Registered in a DAFM approved studbook
- Meet the 4* or 5* performance or progeny/full sister performance requirements
- Mare owners can apply for funding for up to 4 embryos under the scheme in 2017.
- Semen used for the embryo transfers must be from stallions which are Approved in a WBFSH studbook or a pony studbook approved by DAFM.

Key dates:

- The embryo transfer must take place at a designated clinic after the 8th June
- An application must be submitted before the 31st August 2017
- A payment of €700 per embryo will be payable to the owner upon submission of a veterinary declaration confirming that the recipient has been scanned in foal after 60 days.

We Are a Grassroots Industry with Huge **Ambitions**

s I write these few words the show season is in full swing throughout the country. This phenomenon is taken for granted by many as it seems to occur every year without fail. But just think about it for a second. This only takes place through huge effort and voluntary input from community based individuals and organisations. These shows reflect the diversity of our sector - competitions of all sorts for all sorts of exhibitors, horses, riders and owners.

Then of course one has the top international shows such as the RDS where the cream rises to the top. In addition we have top class riders based throughout the world who ride for our country and act as great ambassadors for us. Furthermore we have very generous owners who make their horses available to jump under the Irish flag. Increasing resources must be the key goal for the organisation going forward.

We have come a long way but change is inevitable in our sector as in any other. So I exhort our affiliates to stick together and embrace desirable change. Let's keep our eyes firmly on the big picture, be ambitious for our sector and help create a brighter future for all.

The Mares of Killossery by Michael Slavin

ounted in the indoor school at Killossery Stud in Rolestown, County Dublin is an enlarged copy of the breeder certificate that Laura Glynn received at the 2016 World Breeding Championships in Lanaken after Killossery Kaiden won the six-year-old Championship there for Ger O'Neill. "It was the most wonderful moment of my breeding career", she notes of the presentation at the centre of the main arena when she was recognised as the breeder of Kaiden by Lux Z out of Killossery Kruisette by Cruising.

Talking to Laura is to share in her superb sense of wonder at what super animals her Killossery mares are and what they have done in a breeding programme that began almost 50 years ago out on the Cavan/Westmeath border near the famed Bridge of Finnea. As Laura recalls it, "My sister and myself were big into ponies; so in 1959 our father Robbie Balbirnie decided that he was going to have an equine hobby as well. At Cavan Mart he bought himself a mare called Cliften Lass that was said to be by the great Thoroughbred Chou

Thus began a journey paved with the genes of good mares that has had many high points along the way and which culminated in that moment at the top of the world in Lanaken last September. Cliften Lass was bred to the Thoroughbred Radical to produce Jeannie, who was named after Laura's mum. Jeannie, in turn, went to the great jumper Cruising and the result was Kaiden's dam Killossery Kruisette that Capt. David O'Brien rode to Nations Cup level. Jeannie also produced Killossery that went to the Army as well to be ridden internationally by Capt. Shane Carey. "All of my mares have done something", Laura says earnestly.

So how many Killossery mares do you have now? I asked. "At one time I had 20", she sheepishly replies. "But my son Ciaran, who now runs Killossery Stud for my husband Frank and I, found out and I am now back to just seven". In addition to Killossery Kruisette, who is now rising 23, there is her half sister Kruella by Ballianvella; Kruisita by Cruising out of a Horos(TB) dam; Karina by Spring Diamond out of a half sister to Comdt. John Ledingham's great team horse Kilbaha and Robin's Nest by Master Imp. All carry the Killossery prefix and as Laura says all have done something. Both Karena and Kruisita competed up to European Eventing Championship level. Robin's Nest was at the



World Breeding Championship as a six-yearold. Both Kruella and Karina now have five-year-olds by Flexible with Ger O'Neill. We may soon hear from them as the season gets going. Laura now also has a four-year-old stallion out of Kruisette by Clover Flush called Killossery Clover that is standing for her with Richie Fitzgerald in Waterford. His first foals



will be on the ground this year.

In addition to the five breeding mares there are also two very important dams at Killossery. These are good strong well bred surrogate mares called Kerry and Shannon who carry foals for the others. "Kruisette is 23 now but she has never carried a foal. That is the job of Kerry and Shannon through Embryo Transfer with our vet Larry Dunne". Laura notes. This fact, indeed may be part of the success at Killossery. Most of the breeding mares are well along in age now but they have never had the stress of carrying a foal.

Along with the busy breeding programme at Killossery there is also a huge year-round series of shows and events that take place both in the indoor and the many arenas spread throughout its 80 plus acres. Ciaran now manages that part of the operation. Laura and Frank's second son Robert and their daughter Sara both rode in eventing and show jumping. Robert is now an interior designer while Sara is in marketing. Frank looks upon all of this as his hobby since he is still with Nissan.

And what of Laura's breeding plans going forward? On the day I visited with her the Glynns had just received word that Ciaran had made the list of Irish to compete at Badminton. So, a good part of her thinking is now concentrated on producing a good Irish eventer. "I know that for show jumping you have to go Continental but my dream is to find a big strong Thoroughbred stallion that moves, jumps, has a good front on him to breed a nice

eventer. But he is not easy to find". She will put a couple of mares to Newmarket Venture who has done well eventing wise for Billy Daly's Scarteen Stud. Robin's Nest is in foal to him right now. She also hopes to draw on Imperious bloodlines through Golden Master. Regarding show jumping, she says that husband Frank would like to put Kruisette to Olympic champion Big Star. But she also has her eye on Billy Twomey's good winner, Joe Flynn's Ardcolum Duke. Then there is the son of Coronet Obolensky, Cobra, that now stands at Drumhowan Stud in Castleblaney. On a light note Laura says Drumhowan is one of the studs she likes because they never say that they do not do semen on a Sunday. This the kind of down to earth, practical person that has made this Finnea lady by way of Killossery Rolestown such a good success. Long may it work for her and for the Irish Horse.





HSI Sport Horse Foal

he HSI Sport Horse Foal Championship 2017 with a very generous prize fund of almost €30,000, aims to identify, evaluate and reward breeders who have bred a foal that has the potential to be competitive at the highest International level in the disciplines of show jumping or eventing.

This year there will be 6 regional qualifiers held in July and August with separate sections for potential showjumping foals and potential eventing foals. Foals will be permitted to enter one regional qualifier but will not be confined to entering the qualifier in their own region. €3,000 in prize money will be on offer at each of the qualifiers where 4 foals will be selected for the Final; the best show jumping type colt and filly, and the best eventing type colt and filly.

The final will take place at on the 2nd September at the Irish Breeders Classic Show in Barnadown Stud, Gorey, Co. Wexford. A pot of € 10,000 will be on offer and four Champions will be named, Champion Showjumping Foal (Colt & Filly) and Champion Eventing Foal (Colt & Filly). There will also be a special prize for the best overall TIH foal.

Criteria for entry

- Foals must be registered in a studbook that is a member of the WBFSH or Weatherbys (pending DNA where this can be verified by the studbook is acceptable) and must be shown with their dams where possible.
- Foals are only permitted to enter one regional qualifier but will not be limited to competing in the region in which the owner resides.
- Foals must be entered in either the Showjumping Section or the Eventing Section. They cannot compete in both sections.
- The dam's passport should be available on the day for inspection where possible.
- All foals must be a minimum of 6 weeks old to compete at the Final.
- All foals must be named in order to compete in the Final.

Competitors

- Foals must be lead to and from the arena, and only turned loose when requested to do so by the judges.
- The judge's decision as announced for the qualifiers and Championship is final, the only exception is where the pedigree of the foal is not subsequently confirmed by DNA.
- Pedigree points allocation are based on the information provided by the owner on the completed entry form and these

points allocated in the qualifier will not change retrospectively for the qualifier, but they may be updated for the final should additional information be forthcoming.

Preparation

It is important for the foals to be well prepared for the classes. To practice for the championship it is wise that the foal has been familiarised with the headcollar and leading at a young age. During the events the foals may not have lost all of their foal hairs. The judges will only examine the quality of the foal and does not pay attention to colour or coat. During the classes a foal's health is more important than show condition coat.

These classes are not traditional show foal classes, they are for potential performance animals. Any evidence of foals having been over-fed or pushed to grow and develop unnaturally, which could be detrimental for their future bone development and general wellbeing will be penalised.

Judging Criteria:

There will be two judges for each category of Show jumping and Eventing.

Foals will be judged according to the following criteria.

- 1. Functional conformation
- 2. Walk
- 3. Trot
- 4. Canter
- 5. Overall athleticism and balance
- 6. Pedigree

The judges will be provided with pedigee and performance information for each of the foals, privided by the owner.

Scoring will be judged out of 100 and will be based on the following traits:

Indecon Report Review of Certain Matters Relating to Horse Sport Ireland

Indecon - June 2017

In 2015, a strategy report on the future of the sport horse industry, entitled "Reaching New Heights: Report of Irish Sport Horse Industry Strategy Committee" was published.

One of the recommendations of this report was that a review of the structures of HSI should be undertaken. The Department of Agriculture Food and the Marine commissioned Indecon International Consultants to undertake this review.

The review was aimed at ensuring that the governance and administration of Horse Sport Ireland together with the relationship, supports and programmes provided by it are effective, transparent and are optimal in terms of maximising the development of the industry.

To assist its deliberations Indecon held discussions with members of the board of Horse Sport Ireland, the two HSI sub-boards (Breeding and Sport), HSI staff as well as interested stakeholders and noted the views expressed in some 65 submissions.

In particular, Indecon examined whether HSI operates in accordance with best practice governance principles, how it relates to the Irish Horse Board and other affiliates, the quality of its breeding and performance database structure and programmes and supports provided by HSI to sporting and breeding organisations.

Indecon's report was published in June 2017 and its findings can be categorised under four headings

- Governance,
- Structures,
- Breeding and Performance Database Structures.
- · Supports and Programmes.

Governance

As regards governance in HSI, Indecon examined the role of the Board and the expertise of its members, benchmarking it with current best practice in private and public organisations and the roles of boards in providing strategic direction, risk management, financial governance and oversight of expenditure.

It noted that a medium-term Strategic Plan and the formulation of a Risk Register were work in progress within HSI and that it had a Finance Committee with an independent chair but does not have an internal audit department.

Indecon recommended specific skills are

required by Board members, corporate governance training is needed, some Board members should serve on Audit and Finance Committee and the Board should review the allocation of its time to core responsibilities.

Structures

Indecon also examined the method of appointing board members. This includes the Chairman being nominated by the Minister for Transport Tourism and Sport in consultation with the Minister for Agriculture Food and the Marine and other members nominated by various affiliated bodies.

Indecon found the terms of appointments of HSI directors to be unusual in that some rotating directors are only appointed for two years and the practice that some directors are appointed to represent the views of specific groups rather than to ensure the collective responsibility and authority of the Board is safeguarded. It also found the Board and subboards to be too large and proposed a smaller board with relevant skills (current board of 19 reduced to 9). It said the sub-boards should be replaced with consultative advisory councils for Sports, Breeding and Leisure, with the chair of each being a member of the Board of HSI. It also said that HSI should retain


responsibility for national breeding policy but that it should consider transferring the ISH and ID Studbooks to the Irish Horse Board which would be treated impartially as an affiliate.

Breeding and Performance Database Structures

As regards national databases Indecon found problems with accessability, comprehensiveness and the methodology and proposes better centralisation and integration of information.

Supports and Programmes

In reviewing the funding of HSI, Indecon found that additional resources will be needed to support the expansion of the sector and that cost effective programmes and their impacts should be continuously evaluated. It recommended that HSI submit a costed submission to Government outlining what could be achieved from exchequer funding and options for other funding sources. It said that future programmes to be implemented by HSI should be aligned with the objectives of Reaching New Heights and HSI should be the co-ordinating body for the implementation of that study.



Knowledge Transfer Equine Programme - Declan McArdle

he first year of the Knowledge Transfer Equine (KTE) programme closed on July 31st. For those involved in the programme there are 2 remaining years. The programme has hit many a headline over the past two years, mainly due to IT issues and delays in getting the programme off the ground. However putting aside the delays, I feel the overall concept of the programme and the benefit to breeders is hugely positive. I am of the view that this scheme has massive potential to advance our Sport Horse industry.

I have been involved in the programme as a facilitator and have a very active group in the north east of the country. The group are very passionate and have a strong desire to improve their enterprises and learn from others. They are a dynamic group, with breeders of show jumpers, eventers, Irish Draught's and Connemara ponies.

As with all groups, each of the members of this north east KTE must attend at least five meetings during every year of the three year programme. There is a list of some 30 suggested subjects for these meetings that range from National Breeding Goals to Preparation of a Mare for Inspection to Marketing and Foal assessment. However groups are not confined to that list of suggestions and can come up with one for a particular meeting which is of special current interest for that group. To give you the best idea of how a group works in practice I will discuss how my group operates.

My role is to facilitate and direct discussion and to get the group talking and give everyone an opportunity to speak, I divide the group into sub groups and give them a subject to discuss among themselves and then return to contribute to the full meeting. This has worked well as I can see how the members have grown in confidence and are more open to sharing their knowledge with each other in such a short period of time.

The members of the group don't see the group ending after the scheme is completed. They wish to continue and develop the group. With this in mind they elected Kevin Enright as chairman of the group. Kevin saw the potential of being involved in the knowledge transfer programme and aided significantly in putting the group together. "When this programme was first recommended in the Reaching New Heights Report, it was welcomed by a number of breeders in the north east who realised the benefits and saw it as an opportunity of setting up a breeders group in a structured manner with the support of an expert facilitator. We have a range of people involved, from amateur breeders to industry professionals all of whom bring their own perspective to the fore. This maximises the transfer of knowledge within the group and provides a local support network. As the programme developed it forced us all to look critically at our mares, breeding decisions, selling strategies, costs and returns. Getting



these decisions right is the key to producing good quality horses of a type demanded by the market. There is no doubt that the KTE programme has filled a major gap in the Department's support for the sport horse industry."

The group was approved by the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine (DAFM) in October 2016 and we have held six official meetings along with members attending the Teagasc National Equine conference and other DAFM Knowledge transfer events around the country. I also visited each of the participant's premises to discuss their farm improvement plan and health and safety document with them.

Our first meeting took place at Hilton View Stud with Clem Mc Mahon as a guest speaker. The meeting focused on the attributes of the modern day show jumper and Clem showed and loose jumped a selection of horses highlighting the desirable traits to look for when choosing a mare to breed for the show jumping market. Clem felt that the canter is extremely important and the mare should be athletic herself and ideally from a performance rich family.

Part of the requirements of the scheme was that facilitators had to run two compulsory meetings, one on Health and Safety and one with an approved DAFM vet. One of our members Vincent Murray very kindly opened his yard for the health and safety meeting to take place. The key focus of the meeting was to create awareness of accidents on farms and how to prevent them from happening. We discussed working and handling young horses, working with machinery as well as structuring the day and having adequate help when required.

We visited the practice of Peadair O Scanaill for the veterinary meeting and Peadar gave a two hour presentation on pre breeding management and foaling.

Two meetings were held in the Teagasc office in Drogheda and the focus was on the market place and the necessary attributes a mare and stallion should bring to the table for the chosen markets. Understanding linear scoring, Estimated Breeding Values, along with using IHR Online and other databases were all discussed as potential tools to aid breeders

make more informed decisions.

Our last official meeting took place at McKee barracks at the Army equitation school. Lt Col Tom Freyne and his team showcased a selection of horses under saddle. Tom discussed what they look for when buying horses and how the army equitation school is relying on Irish breeders to breed horses which they can compete with at international level. He spoke about the opportunity of leasing a mare to the school and getting her back at the end of her career for the purposes of breeding. He stressed that when a breeder has a good horse, not to rush it, train it correctly so as reap the financial rewards. A member of the group who competes at national level also stressed this point, that many horses are not achieving their true potential by being asked too much at

As part of the scheme participants must include two of their studbook registered mares in their Farm Improvement Plan and have them inspected by an EU approved studbook. This could be carried out last spring or this autumn if the mares hadn't already been inspected. Participants having their mares inspected for the programme was a positive step as it forced participants to critically appraise their mares based on the independent appraisal they received at inspection. Taking into consideration their inspection results, research they had carried out on the mares dam line and having to do the Farm Improvement Plan for the scheme some of the group members decided to change their breeding goal for their mares and some decided that maybe the mare did not bring enough to the table to breed from and have decided to look at upgrading their mares as a result.

As we now head into the second year of the programme, I can already see the group have gelled. Kevin keeps in regular contact with the group and he organised a visit to a stud farm earlier in the year for the group which was not an official meeting. This shows that the group model is working where breeders are working together for the benefit of each other. Speaking to other equine facilitators around the country this group is not unique. There is a hunger for knowledge and a desire to breed commercially viable horses. Given a chance this scheme can offer great support for breeders to do just that.

he 2016 Horse Sport Ireland breeder awards were held at the Springfort Hall Hotel, Mallow, Co. Cork on Wednesday 23rd November 2016.

The top award on the night which was for his **Outstanding Contribution to ISH Breeding** went to Mr Tom Jones from Co

Monaghan. Tom has been involved in horses from a very early age and bred and stands the 4

Star Stallion CARRICK DIAMOND LAD (ISH){TIH}.

"Presently, Tom has in the region of thirty broodmares, which are mainly related to the top sires of the past such as the great Clover Hill, Highland Flight, Flagmount Diamond, Sky Boy, First Consul, Ozymandias, Cruising, Snuff Box and many more. Tom was also a founding member of the North Eastern Horse Breeders Group which was set up in the early 1990's to educate and inform Irish breeders of the way ahead. He has embraced modern technology/social networking to promote his stallions and to sell online. This is a real success story with clients as far away as Australia, New Zealand, South Africa and America sourcing frozen semen from Carrick Diamond Lad and selling young horses all over England and Europe.

William Kells, the breeder of MIGHTY NICE (ISH)[was Over the Vee] currently ranked 2nd in the WBFSH rankings received the award as **Breeder of the Highest Placed ISH in the WBFSH Eventing Rankings 2016.** MIGHTY NICE (ISH) won an individual Olympic bronze medal for Phillip Dutton and the USA in Rio 2016.

David Moran from Limerick was awarded the Breeder of the Highest Placed ISH in the WBFSH Show Jumping Rankings 2016 for LIMESTONE GREY (ISH) – 2006 gelding by Try Time (KWPN) out of Millpark's Courageous Lady (ISH). A Tradition in Breeding at Tullaghansleek

rive past the beautiful old limestone walls and an ancient royal mound along the avenue to Tullaghansleek Stud and you know you are in a place tradition was king. The metal sign at the main gate reads Established 1867. And when you meet Tim and Finola Carey you will be assured that their family of seven are the seventh generation of Carey's on this 200 acre Westmeath farm. On the living room mantle is a stud notice dated 1887 stating that covering charges for "Gentlemen and Substantial Farmers" was £2-.0 -0 while there was a reduced rate for "Small Farms" of £1 – 10s.


Down the years the Carey's of Tullaghansleek have stood Thoroughbred, Irish Draught and Connemara stallions of quality. In more recent times there have been the likes of Euphemism, Blue Cliff, Golden Cliff, New Frontier all of which were made available for non-thoroughbred mares.

Currently on the stud's roster are three
Thoroughbreds Golden Lariat(Pr.
Prospector/Sadler's Wells), Retirement
Plan(Monsun/Dansili) and Shadow Gate(White
Muzzle/Sunday Silence); two Irish Draught
Fintan Himself(Uibh Fhaili/Colman) and
Carrickcottage Star(Carrickrock Close

Shave/Huntingfield Rebel) plus two Connemaras Gwennic de Goariva and Drimcong Cave.

Of the Thoroughbreds Shadow Gate is designated for non – thoroughbred service. "A good model and athletic type" Tim notes of him. "We like to serve a right good model of a mare but they are missing right now", When Tim emphasises right good model you know first of all that he is Westmeath born and bred and also that he is heart and soul an Irish horse man.

During his showing career to date Tim has won Dublin and All Ireland young horse and



mare championships. During one particular season he recorded no fewer than 35 championship titles with Golden Optimist by Euphemism. Tim is a sound judge and with beautifully easy enthusiasm he exclaims "I just love judging a nice young horse".

As to the mares he says that what you really need is one that will breed a lightweight or middleweight champion at Dublin. "That young horse can then go on to be a nice athletic world class show jumper, eventer or show horse".

Tullaghansleek Stud's top Thoroughbred stallion Golden Lariat has indeed bred a Dublin lightweight champion. But here is the rub! He has become so popular as sire of winning point – to – pointers that he can now command a service fee in the region of 2,000. Nearly 100% of his runners have been winners and some of his progeny have been sold at Goffs Punchestown Sale for over 100,000. Thus, this season Golden Lariat will be 'restricted' in terms of non – thoroughbred coverings. At length Tim will discuss this dilemma. "Perhaps because it is part of our tradition and

I just do not know any better, we will always stand a thoroughbred for the non — thoroughbred mare but to be frank it is just not profitable", he says sadly. So here are the facts. In the thoroughbred world the breeding is now concentrated on speed so a good strong National Hunt type sire is hard to find. If one is found, it will cost over the 100,000 mark, too much for the non — thoroughbred market where average covering fees are in the 450 Euro range. On top of that, Tim notes that in trying to buy this kind of horse you are up against very deep pockets from the Middle East.

During our visit, as an illustration of what could be missed, Tim and Finola along with two of their very enthusiastic daughters, Claire and Susan brought out Golden Lariat – a superb athletic looking horse. Then they presented one of his daughters – a lovely mare owned by Paddy McNamara of Shinrone, County Offaly who is a former Limerick Lady and Limerick Matron winner and is a real solid beauty.

So is there a solution to the dilemma that the kind of quality Thoroughbred needed for the

Irish Sport Horse Industry being priced out of that market? Would some form of subsidy for buying TB stallions for the industry work? Very quickly Tim answers, "Between 30,000 and 70,000 Euro would be needed but since it would be giving preferential treatment I do not think it would be allowed under EU regulations. So what about doing a Dick Jennings? Back in the seventies, under the old Bord na gCapall Dick bought good sires like Bahrain and placed them at studs around the country. "Yes" said Tim, "that might work" but did not seem quite sure. So for now at least, the Irish Sport Horse industry's need for a fruitful input of good solid Thoroughbred blood into the system is going to depend on people like the Carey's who follow a long standing tradition in supporting the non - thoroughbred world because they just love to see a really nice young horse that could win the lightweight or middleweight championship at Dublin and go on from there to be what we all hope for - a world class Irish bred.

WBFSH Young Horse Show Jumping Championships at Lanaken

Irish Sport Horses produced fantastic results at the World Breeding Jumping Championships at Lanaken last September by winning a hat trick of Medals, Gold Silver and Bronze.

Michael Pender, from Co Carlow won both the Silver and Bronze medals in the five-year-old final at the World Breeding Jumping Championships from 229 starters. Pender took the early lead in the 20 horse jump-off with the mare Z Seven Canya Dance (ISH), who was bred by Anne Hughes from Co Kilkenny. Pender then beat his own target time with his second mare, Z Seven Caretina, who was bred by Marion Hughes.

Dutchman Willem Greve with the stallion Garant (KWPN) took the World Championship Gold medal finishing just four tenths of a second ahead of Pender who took Silver with Z Seven Caretina (ISH) and Bronze with Z Seven Canya Dance (ISH).

In what turned out to be an outstanding weekend for the Irish breeding industry, Kilkenny's Ger O'Neill and The Irish Sport Horse Killossery Kaiden produced the only double clear of the competition to take the coveted winner's trophy in the six-year-old championship. Beating Julian de Boer and Fernando V by a comfortable 12 seconds. Interestingly, Killossery Kaiden (ISH) was born using the technology of Embryo transfer, as his breeder Laura Glynn didn't wish his dam Killossery Kruisette (ISH) to carry the foal naturally. Another half brother, by Clinton, made the highest price at the Irish breeders Classic Elite Foal Sale las year.

Michael Pender had already won the Six Year Old Consolation Final the previous day riding Curra Clover Flight (ISH) with Ireland's Shane Dalton and Castlelawn Captain Junior (ISH) placing second in the Five Year Old Consolation Final.

Horse Sport Ireland Director of Breeding and Programmes, Alison Corbally added: "Out of over 750 of the best young horses in the world, to have won three out of the possible nine medals was a tremendous achievement for the breeders, owners and riders of the horses concerned.

It is a great reflection of the improved quality of show jumpers being bred in Ireland and produced through the young horse classes. Sincere congratulations are due to all the breeders involved."



It is currently run across 4 levels from the one-day Introduction to Coaching course to the 9-day discipline specific Level 3 National coach course. The courses offer a comprehensive understanding of modern competition requirements, coaching skills, technical knowledge and principles of good communication. They are also suitable for parents, breeders, young horse producers, competitors, riding school instructors and anyone involved with horses or who has an interest in the industry.

All courses are delivered by professional equestrian tutors with vast experience in the industry both in Ireland and worldwide. The courses also provide participants with a framework of progressive exercises to develop horses using modern systematic training methods. This allows horses to be produced in the classically correct manner, therefore maximising their re-sale value.

The HSI Coaching Programme is accredited jointly by Horse Sport Ireland and Sport Ireland Coaching (formerly Coaching Ireland). Sport Ireland Coaching (SIC) has the lead role in the development of coaching on an all island basis, highlighting the importance of quality coaching in developing athletes and providing opportunities for participants.

HSI Introduction to Coaching – This one-day course is open to all. The course provides candidates with the basic principles of coaching, a better understanding of modern competition requirements, and a detailed understanding of the HSI Coaching Programme and of the work involved to become a qualified equestrian coach.

HSI Level 1 Apprentice Coach - The aim of the HSI Apprentice Coach qualification is to provide participants with the skills and techniques to work competently as an apprentice coach at novice level. The HSI Level 1 Apprentice Coach course is the foundation for further coaching qualifications and it is a requirement to progress further up the HSI Coaching ladder.

HSI Level 2 Coach - The HSI Level 2 Coach course provides coaches with the necessary skills and technical knowledge to work as an independent equestrian coach up to elementary level dressage, 1.20m show jumping and CCI1* – $2\ast$ eventing. This course is a progression from the HSI Level 1 Apprentice Coach course and is the first level at which a coach will be qualified as an independent equestrian coach upon successful completion.

HSI Level 3 National Coach - The HSI Level 3 National Coach course provides coaches with the capacity to train performance riders to compete at the highest level at regional and national competition. The HSI Level 3 Coach course is discipline specific. There are individual courses and qualifications for each discipline: dressage, show jumping or eventing, however, there are some core elements which will be similar in all three fields.

Since the HSI Coaching Programme has been operational it has been hugely successful and hundreds of courses have been delivered all around Ireland and further afield. The HSI Coaching system has been adopted by the British Equestrian Federation (BEF), Horsescotland, The Hungarian Equestrian Federation (HUN) and the Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI).

ISH Young Breeders

he Young Breeders programme is a joint programme between Teagasc and Horse Sport Ireland. The programme is aimed at those between the ages of 14 to 25 years who are interested in assessing, exhibiting, and breeding performance horses. They do not have to be breeders themselves or come from an equestrian background. An avid interest and an eagerness to participate and learn is all that is required.

The skills and knowledge transferred through training serve as a foundation for those with an interest in developing their knowledge of the horse. These skills come into focus for varied uses including purchasing a new horse/pony; deciding about which mares/stallions to use for breeding; assessing offspring; presenting horses for inspection, sale, show or competition.

The ISH Young Breeders National Competition took place at Teagasc, Kildalton Agricultural College in November 2016. Over 30 young breeders took part in the competition which involved a theory test, judging horses on gaits and loose jumping, assessing the conformation and presenting a horse in hand.

The results of the National Competition were used to form a panel from which the teams were selected to represent the Irish Sport Horse Studbook in the 2017 WBFSH Young Breeders World Championship scheduled to be held in Calgary, Canada between the 20th and 22nd July 2017.

Horse Sport Ireland Mare Championships 2016

he aim of the Showjumping and Eventing Mare Championships is to identify, evaluate and reward owners of mares that are capable of performing at the highest level in International Showjumping/Eventing and are suitable for producing progeny that would be competitive at the highest level in both disciplines.

A prize fund of \in 15,000 was on offer for each of the Championships in 2016 which was open to 5 and 6 year old mares that are registered in a studbook that is a member of the WBFSH, or registered with Weathersby's. The Matron Scheme was in operation for both of the Mare Championships allowing for 6 year old mares with a foal registered on the IHR to compete in the 5 year old section and 7 year old mares with a foal registered on the IHR to compete in the 6 year old section.

The Eventing mare championship took place in September 2016 at Lisgarvan Horse Trials, Ballon, Co. Carlow and the Showjumping championship took place in October 2016 at Cavan Equestrian Centre, Co. Cavan.



Strangles

ver the past few years, there has been an increase in the number of cases of Strangles. Contrary to reports, there have been no deaths due to this disease. While the number of cases is on the increase, there have always been cases of Strangles isolated in Ireland at the Irish Equine Centre.

Strangles is a common problem in horses, both thoroughbred and non-thoroughbred, although most cases we see are in nonthoroughbreds. It is also a disease that raises alarm bells when confirmed. Strangles is a bacterial disease caused by a species of bacterium called Streptococcus equi. The disease is acute and highly contagious. Clinical signs include high fever, coupled with inflammation of the upper respiratory tract and lymph nodes. Morbidity is high although mortality is low. Complications include sinusitis, guttural pouch infections and abscesses. It is spread from horse to horse via direct nose to nose contact, through aerosol droplets and via contact with nasal discharges.

Horses of any age are susceptible, but those most disposed are between one and five years. Susceptible horses usually acquire the disease after being exposed to another horse that is shedding the Streptococcus equi bacteria that causes the illness. Often, this can be a new horse being introduced to the herd. Although it may no longer be showing signs of the disease, infected newcomers can spread it for about a month. Shedding the bacteria can continue for up to one month after all clinical signs are gone.

Horse to horse contact is the easiest way Strangles infects, but it can also be spread through contaminated equipment such as buckets, stalls and tack. Fortunately, the bacteria cannot exist in the environment for long periods.

Outbreaks of the disease occur mainly in young animals under crowded conditions and the disease is often more severe in younger animals. The incubation period for the disease was thought to be 3-10 days but recent evidence has shown that the incubation period may be much longer. This presents a more worrying scenario for the owner from a

management point of view.

Strangles is highly contagious, with transmission occurring by the oral and nasal routes. Communal drinking sources, population density and mobility are important risk factors and survive for several weeks in water troughs, but dies quickly in soil and on pasture.


When abscesses burst the pus is creamy and yellow / white in colour. The organism is very resistant to the external environment and can survive for many months in stables. Bacterial cultures from abscesses or nasal swabs are useful in confirming the condition and can often help in avoiding misdiagnosis in horses with mild signs and not Strangles.

Additionally, many horses which develop Strangles and show clinical signs do not go on to develop the classic abscessed lymph nodes or purulent nasal discharge. These horses, however, may excrete Streptococcus equi from their nasal passages and be a source of infection to other susceptible horses.

Generally, treatment with penicillin is reserved for horses with severe Strangles, complicated by high temperatures and difficulty in breathing. Most veterinary practitioners prefer to let the condition take its course. This facilitates the best immune response. Daily temperature taking, monitoring of feed and drink intake plus good hygiene are essential. Most horses recover uneventfully and are no longer contagious one month after clinical signs disappear. A lot of owners will check to see that no carrier state exists and will get their veterinary surgeon to take nasal swabs on a regular period after the animal is clinically cured.

Good management is vitally important in controlling the disease. Good disinfection procedures can help eliminate the causal organism from the immediate environment. Isolation of infected animals is also important.

Vaccination may provide the best possible protection against Strangles. Regular programmes of vaccination will reduce the incidence and severity of the disease.



Control of Strangles

- 1. Vaccination
- 2. Seek veterinary advice if Strangles is widespread
- 3. Isolate infected animals
- 4. Educate workers about the disease
- 5. A disinfection regime together with good practices
- 6. Antibiotic therapy, if necessary

he Irish Sport Horse Studbook has once again been crowned as the World Breeding Federation for Sport Horses (WBFSH) leading Eventing Studbook in the world for 2016. Since the WBFSH rankings were established in 1994, the Irish Sport Horse Studbook has won the coveted Eventing Studbook rankings for 21 of the last 23 years.

The rankings for the 2016 season take account of FEI competitions from 1st October 2015 to 30th September 2016. The highest-ranked Irish Sport Horse in the individual WBFSH rankings was Olympic Bronze medallist, Mighty Nice (ISH), bred by William Kells in Cavan.



The Irish Sport Horse Studbook has finished in third place overall, at the WBFSH World Breeding Eventing Championships which concluded at Le Lion d'Angers in France on the 20th to the 23rd October 2016.

The Irish Sport Horse, Business Class, ridden by Sophie Richards, produced an excellent performance to finish seventh overall in the six-year-old competition. Owned and bred by Don Hadden from Co Wicklow, Business Class (ISH) and Richards were faultless in the Cross Country phase and also in the final Show Jumping, to finish on their Dressage score of 51.1.

Also in the six-year-old final, Cornascriebe Glenpatrick (ISH) and Harold Megahey finished just outside the top 10, taking 11th place (53.4) when adding just two time penalties in the Show Jumping arena. The Irish Sport Horse WSF Carthago (56.5) took 17th place with Fiona Breach (GBR), while DSL The Professor (ISH) and Elizabeth Hayden finished in 26th place overall (62.1).

In the seven-year-old final, The Irish Sport Horse Sammy Davis Junior (ISH), bred by Amanda Vogan from Co. Cavan, finished best of the Irish in 14th place (54.9) when ridden by Galway's Cathal Daniels. Sportsfield Lord Livesey (ISH) and Mathew Heath (GBR) finished in 17th place (56.5), one spot ahead of Poynstown Will (ISH) ridden by Ciara Power who finished on a score of 54.9. Kincooley Cruising. (ISH) and Tim Price (NZL) came home in 20th place (58.6).


