New chairman of Horse Sport Ireland

Patrick Wall was appointed as the new chairman of Horse Sport Ireland on 6th February following his nomination by Minister for Transport, Tourism and Sport, Leo Varadkar.

Patrick Wall is Professor of Public Health at University College Dublin and is qualified both as a veterinary surgeon

and a medical doctor. He was nominated by Minister Varadkar, in consultation with the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Simon Coveney, and with Minister of State for Tourism and Sport, Michael Ring, and appointed by the board of directors of Horse Sport Ireland.

Minister Varadkar said: "Patrick Wall brings a wealth of experience and expertise which will enable Horse Sport Ireland to develop further in the years ahead, building on the very solid foundation which has been laid for the organisation by outgoing chairman Joe Walsh.

His previous experience as a chairman and a chief executive will be useful in this role, along with his ongoing participation in equestrian sports. I also want to take this opportunity to thank Joe for his exemplary work in bringing the different elements of equestrian sport together and for his contribution to the sport".

Joe Walsh said: "Professor Wall has an outstanding CV and I am sure he will be a strong, progressive and independently-minded chairman of Horse Sport Ireland."

Dr Wall was co-author of the 2010 UCD report on horse welfare in Ireland, commissioned by World Horse Welfare. He is a co-director of the UCD/Redmills Advanced Certificate in Applied Equine Husbandry, a new course developed for individuals from the fledgling Chinese sport horse industry. He is the former head of the Food Safety Authority of Ireland and a former chairman of the European Food Safety Authority.

It is an honour to be the new chairman of HSI and I hope with the help of the HSI executive staff and the members of the management board, sub boards and committees, that, together, we can build on the many achievements to date, overseen by my predecessor Joe Walsh.

We have never had as many elite riders willing and able to don the green jacket. The HSI coaching regimes are bearing fruit and we have a great cohort of young people coming through. We have great riders but we are currently not breeding enough horses capable of competing internationally in a showjumping sport that is continuously becoming more challenging.

We can regain our rightful position as we have the right type of land to breed good horses, we have the stock people to care for them and we have the riders both to produce and compete them – and we have a passion and enthusiasm for the horse unmatched by other countries. However, we need to acknowledge that we have to become very selective in the mares and stallions we use if we aspire to breed more horses for the lucrative market of international hopefuls.

There is a global market for a range of horses of different abilities for riders of different capabilities. As we face into the new breeding season, we have to do so with optimism and confidence but breeders must consider what segment of the market they are targeting with their breeding strategy.

The high net worth individuals need to be looking to Ireland as the optimum source of sound performers. If we can achieve this, we will get the financial return we deserve for our efforts. The thoroughbred breeders have the mantra: "France for the wine, Brazil for the coffee and Ireland for the horses!". And that's the way it should be for the sport horse also.

International horse of the year

Flexible tops off a glittering 2012

IRISH Sport Horse Flexible won the prestigious United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) International Horse of the Year award for 2012 in January.

Flexible was bred in Ireland by Edward and Catherine Doyle. Partnered by the 53-year-old American rider Rich Fellers, at 17, Flexible himself is one of the oldest horses competing at the top level of international show jumping.

Now owned by US couple Harry and Mollie Chapman, Flexible had a remarkable year in 2012, and, among other major victories, won the show jumping World Cup for America after a 25 year drought and also finished eighth individually in the London Olympics.

A son of the famous Approved Irish Sport Horse stallion Cruising, who was runner-up in the World Cup in 1999 with Irish rider Trevor Coyle, Flexible is an Approved stallion in the Irish Sport Horse studbook.

Edward Doyle was honoured with the award for Breeder of the Top International Show Jumper by Horse Sport Ireland in November last year.

USEF said of its nomination of Flexible: "Flexible has done the unthinkable time after time in his storied career. The stallion with a unique jumping style has twice come back from career threatening injuries and captured top standings at prestigious competitions."

"In 2012, with rider Rich Fellers, Flexible ended the US's 25-year winning drought at the Rolex/FEI World Cup Jumping Finals by out-running the eventual Olympic champions in a jump-off for the ages. Flexible kept up his winning ways in

the 2012 US Show Jumping Observation Events where he claimed victory four times."

"He won twice in Del Mar (the \$50,000 Surfside Grand Prix and the \$100,000 Hermes Grand Prix of Del Mar) and then again six weeks later at Spruce Meadows. Fellers and Flexible jumped four clear rounds in two classes, including two jump-offs in Calgary, to win the \$35,000 Husky Energy Cup and the \$200,000 CN Performance Grand Prix. They then earned their ticket to represent the US at the 2012 Olympic Games in London, where they finished in the top ten and were the highest placing American pair."

Fellers says that Irish Sport Horses are sturdy, brave and intelligent, making them some of the finest equestrian athletes competing today.

"Their natural courage and instincts for jumping, combined with carefulness and competitive desire, make the Irish Sport Horse ideal for show jumping. Flexible is a joy to train. He is still enthusiastic about his work every day, even at the age of 17."

Winning the 2012 Showjumping World Cup finals in 's-Hertogenbosch in The Netherlands was the highlight of the Fellers/Flexible partnership – and indeed Fellers' entire career.

"It is quite unusual for a final to end up in a tie after



three days of competition requiring a jump-off to determine the clear winner," Fellers explains.

"It is also unusual, after completing so many massive rounds, that the two tied horses would jump clear and fast in the jump-off. That was the case on the final day in 's-Hertogenbosch. Flexible's incredible heart and competitive fighting instincts carried us to victory."

"To win the world's most testing indoor competition is an amazing tribute to the quality of Irish breeding, and I want to congratulate the breeders Edward and Catherine Doyle and of course the American rider Rich Fellers for his tremendous skill. I believe it is a testament to the soundness and longevity of the Irish Sport Horse that a horse like Flexible can not only continue to compete at the age of 17, but also beat the world's best in the very toughest of competitions," said former HSI Chairman Joe Walsh after Flexible's victory at the Rolex FEI World Cup.

Olympics & Paralympics review

A huge success for Irish Sport Horses

Sixteen Irish-bred horses competed at the London Olympic Games, these included 15 Irish Sport Horses and one Irish-bred thoroughbred. Four Irish Sport Horses featured in the top 10 in Eventing, while two Irish Sport Horses finished in the top 20 in Showjumping.

Eventing: Four in top 10

In Eventing, the British team that won the silver medal featured two Irish Sport Horses, Imperial Cavalier (individual fifth), ridden by Mary King, and High Kingdom (individual eighth), ridden by Zara Phillips. The top-placed Irish rider was Aoife Clark on board Master Crusoe (ISH) who finished seventh individually. The top-placed US horse was Mr Medicott (ISH), who finished ninth individually with Karen O'Connor. The remarkable 20-year-old Lenamore (ISH), ridden by Caroline Powell, was part of the New Zealand bronze medal winning team. The Irish Team finished fifth overall and consisted of five Irish Sport Horses. The next best Irish rider was Joseph Murphy, who finished 14th on Electric Cruise (ISH), while Mark Kyle finished 21st on Coolio (ISH).

Showjumping: Two in top 20

In Showjumping, two Irish Sport Horses finished in the top 20, with Flexible (ISH) and Rich Fellers finishing eighth for the USA and the mare Castlefield Eclipse (ISH) and Paul Estermann finishing 17th for Switzerland.

Paralympics: One silver, two bronze

In the Paralympics, Helen Kearney from Dunlavin, Co. Wicklow, rode the remarkable Mister Cool (ISH) to win individual silver and individual bronze medals and led Ireland to a historic team bronze medal.

Horse Sport Ireland produced a special supplement with details of all Irish Sport Horses selected for the Olympic Games and a list of all Irish Sport Horses that made the nominated entry list. This was widely circulated to the media at the Games and was used by TV commentators all over the world



who announced breeding details for these Irish Sport Horses.

The Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Simon Coveney, also issued a press release congratulating the breeders, commenting: **“This is a fantastic accolade for all the Irish Sport Horse breeders involved. To breed a horse that is good enough to be selected for the Olympic Games is a great honour. Ireland is known throughout the world as a horse breeding nation and this is even further evidence of our prowess in the breeding of sport horses.”**

Industry report

How the sport horse industry contributes to the economy

An in-depth study into the sport horse industry was commissioned by Horse Sport Ireland in 2012. The study was funded under the National Development Plan 2007 to 2013 and was prepared under the guidance of Dr Alan Fahey, UCD School of Agriculture and Food Science.

The resulting report – *Economic Contribution of the Sport Horse Industry to the Irish Economy* – was launched by the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine, Simon Coveney, on 21st November.

The report examined participation, employment and expenditure within the main sport horse sectors: breeding, hunting, competition, equestrian leisure, showing and country shows. Sport horse trade, imports and exports were also examined.

The results of the study highlight the importance of the sport horse industry and its contribution to the Irish economy. Some of the key findings include:

- The sport horse industry contributes €708 million per annum to the Irish economy.
- The sport horse population in Ireland was estimated to be 124,000 equines.
- Over 47,000 people are estimated to be involved in the industry.
- Some 29,295 individuals derive all or part of their income from the sector.
- Total full-time employment in the sector was estimated to be in excess of 12,500 people.

Breeding sector

Breeding was found to be the largest sector within the industry and accounted for a total expenditure of €226 million within the economy. It was estimated there are approximately 15,110 active breeders in the sport horse industry and 74% of employment within the industry is attrib-

uted to the breeding sector.

In 2011, there were over 9,000 foals registered in Ireland (excluding thoroughbreds) in studbooks approved by the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine, the majority of which (approximately 90%) were registered in the Irish Horse Register or the Connemara Pony Studbook.

The reported use of AI among sport horse breeders doubled in Ireland between 2005 and 2011, reaching 32% in 2011.

Although AI usage has increased in Ireland in recent years, it still lags behind other European countries where usage rates are generally over 90%.

Horse sales

The sale of horses through private sales and public auction was investigated using data from public sales venues and questionnaire responses.

It was estimated that 73% of horses are sold privately at an average value of €4,755 and 27% are sold through public auction at an average price of €2,296. With regard to horses sold for export, it was estimated that 56% sold



at auction are exported and 44% sold privately are destined to go abroad.


Overall, the report demonstrates that the sport horse industry in Ireland is a vibrant and complex one. While separate sectors exist (breeding, competition, leisure, etc.) they have a strong symbiotic relationship and, when all sectors are combined, the extent and importance of the industry is evident. Sport horse activity is prevalent in every county in Ireland and, for a relatively modest Government investment, it makes a very significant impact on the Irish economy.


Speaking after the launch of the report, Minister Coveney said: “The sport horse sector is an important part of the economic and social fabric of rural Ireland.

“This report confirms that fact and also provides a very useful source of up-to-date information in terms of devising policy for the sector. I am very pleased that my Department was able to fund the project through the National Development Plan and I want to compliment UCD and Horse Sport Ireland for the professional way in which the project results were presented”.

Former HSI Chairman Joe Walsh said: “I would like to thank UCD and our affiliate bodies for their assistance with the project which is a

Northern Ireland Horse Board affiliates to Horse Sport Ireland

In an historic move, the Northern Ireland Horse Board (NIHB) became affiliated to Horse Sport Ireland from 1st January 2013. The decision to affiliate was approved unanimously at an Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM) of the Northern Ireland Horse Board in November.

Chairman of the Northern Ireland Horse Board, Sam Smyth, said: "We are delighted to have reached this agreement with Horse Sport Ireland. Breeders in Northern Ireland will now receive the same benefits that Horse Sport Ireland is providing to members of the Irish Horse Board.

"Our members are particularly excited about having access to CapallOir as we have been hearing great reports of it from our colleagues across the border.

"The fact that our breeders will be dealing directly with Horse Sport Ireland in relation to registration matters will also improve efficiency.

"The NIHB office will remain open and we will be focusing on recruiting new members and providing seminars

and other services to our members," he explained.

Registration discounts

As a result of this decision, members of the NIHB will receive registration discounts on the same basis as members of the Irish Horse Board (IHB). All passports and registration applications will be sent directly to Horse Sport Ireland in Naas, Co. Kildare, and all processing will be carried out by Horse Sport Ireland.

NIHB members will also receive Horse Sport Ireland publications and will have free access to the widely acclaimed horse resource database CapallOir, up to the same usage limit as IHB members.

The NIHB has also agreed to support an additional leg of the Irish Sport Horse Studbook Series, to be held in Northern Ireland, as well as joint initiatives in other disciplines.

Historic development

When the initiative was first announced, former HSI Chairman Joe

Walsh commented that this was "an historic development for the sport horse sector.

"The NIHB is the democratically elected representative body for breeders in Northern Ireland. Horse Sport Ireland has already been recognised as the Governing Body by Sport Northern Ireland."

Working together

"Since Horse Sport Ireland was established our modus operandi has been to work with the democratic bodies within the sector to try and pull the sector together.

"The only way to move forward is by working together. I am particularly pleased that this decision was approved unanimously at an EGM of the NIHB."

"The real challenge now is to secure more funding for our sector so that we can have improved prize money, and the organisation of an aggressive marketing programme and new training and education programmes at grassroots level."



Irish Draught Horse

Irish Draught Horse Society of Canada harmonises with Ireland

The Irish Draught Horse Society of Canada (IDHSC) has entered into a harmonisation agreement with Ireland. This follows on from the agreement in 2011 which saw the Irish Draught Horse Society of Great Britain (IDHSGB) agreeing to harmonise their studbook rules with the Irish Draught Horse Studbook in Ireland.

Under this agreement, Canada has adopted Ireland's classification and inspection system for Irish Draught Horses. In return, Canada's Irish Draught Horses are now entered into the Irish Draught Horse Studbook in Ireland, giving Canadian horses the same standing in Europe as Irish Draught Horses owned and bred in Ireland and in the UK.

More specifically, this means breeders in Ireland and the UK can now use Canadian Draught stallions (and mares) in their breeding programmes, following the same rules for the progeny's eligibility for registration or inspection.

Worldwide evidence-based approach

The harmonisation agreement is the result of many years of discussion between the Irish Draught Horse Society of Canada and Horse Sport Ireland. Canada sees this agreement as a major step towards a worldwide approach to understanding, preserving and protecting the Irish Draught Horse herd.

"Canada is pleased to be the first non-EU Irish Draught Horse Studbook to harmonise with Ireland," commented Cheryl Anderson, registration officer for Canada, adding: "Harmonisation of Canada does two things for the breed. Firstly, it adds another herd into the HSI database of Irish Draughts found worldwide. HSI's analysis of Irish Draught Studbook genetics allows Canada, the UK and Ireland to take an evidence-based approach to decisions on respective studbook direction. Secondly, it removes trade barriers between Canada and Europe, consistent with our pending free-trade agreement. This is helpful not only to people looking to buy and sell horses, it allows for much freer and less expensive movement of genetic material, which becomes very important when we try to introduce or re-introduce given bloodlines into a country."

The inaugural meeting of International Irish Draught Daughter Studbooks took place at the RDS Dublin Horse Show in August last year, where Canada formally signed the harmonisation agreement.

After the meeting Ms Anderson commented: "The Irish Draught Horse Society of Canada has long believed that if we are serious about preserving the Irish Draught and its characteristics, we must have a single, fact-based understanding of the herd – its composition, its genetics and its traits – on a worldwide basis. Ireland (HSI) has demonstrated that it is willing and able to collect, analyse and share this type of information."

Mare and gelding inspections quickly followed the harmonisation agreement. In October, Dr Charlotte Moore and John Butler travelled to Toronto to conduct inspections and to provide

what turned out to be a very successful education seminar on linear scoring. The owners and participants travelled as much as 800km to watch the process, to listen and learn.

Strong working relationships

Alison Corbally, HSI Director of Breeding and Programmes commented: "It has taken a lot of dialogue, meetings and the development of strong working relationships over the past two years to arrive at this point. I think it is an exciting development for the long-term future of the Irish Draught breed. This will enable easier and hopefully greater trade in both semen and horses in the future, which can only augur well for the spread of genetics within the breed."

Canada is looking forward to a long and fruitful partnership with Ireland and Britain in preserving and promoting the Irish Draught Horse.

Imperial Cavalier impresses at London

IMPERIAL Cavalier was the most successful Irish Sport Horse in Eventing at the London 2012 Olympics, securing a silver medal for Team GB and an Individual fifth placing for Mary King. Together since 2007, Imperial Cavalier and Mary King have competed in an incredible nine four-star international events including London 2012.

World-leading ISH Studbook

Imperial Cavalier, ranked fifth by the World Breeding Federation of Sport Horses (WBFSH), along with Mr Medicott (ISH) ranked first, have helped to raise the profile of the Irish Sport Horse around the world. With Irish Sport Horses of this calibre, it comes as no surprise that the Irish Sport Horse Studbook is currently the leading event horse studbook in the world, winning the FEI WBFSH World Studbook Rankings for Eventing in 2012 (see *Table 1* below).

Bred by John Brennan of Ballyscanlon, Tramore, Co. Waterford, John broke Imperial Cavalier and produced him until he was a four-year-old, as he does with many of his youngsters, then sold him in Goresbridge to Vicky Brake. Vicky began eventing him until

Mary King took over the ride in 2007.

John's aim has always been – and still is – to breed a “good jumping horse with blood and plenty of quality”. Imperial Cavalier's dam Gene Pool (ISH) by Imperius (TB) died last year aged 28, having bred 11 foals with the last born in 2009. Currently, John has three half-sisters to Imperial Cavalier.

Imperius added a lot of quality to Imperial Cavalier, particularly in scope and movement. According to John, it was evident immediately that he was “a gorgeous horse from the day he was born”. He wasn't easy as a three-year-old and it wasn't until he was four or five that he began to show his true potential. John wasn't surprised as many of his siblings had been the same.

Imperial Cavalier was never bold but often energetic, tough and sharp. John explained that “he could spot something five minutes before you would” and that “you'd need a good breakfast before you'd ride him”.

In the run-up to London 2012, Mary King discussed her plans and aims for the Olympics, commenting: “I am so pleased that ‘Archie’ will get the chance to compete at an Olympic Games, he so deserves this opportunity and I am sure he will rise to the occa-



sion. He is a big, powerful horse which means he should be able to cope well with the undulations and be strong enough to handle galloping up and down those hills.”

Imperial Cavalier's achievements

Imperial Cavalier has had an extremely successful career to date. In 2007, he competed in his first four star in Pau, France, where he finished second with Mary King on board.

In 2008 the pair finished in third position at one of the world's toughest four star cross-country tracks; Burghley Horse Trials. In 2009, an injury ruled him out of the European Championships in Fontainebleau, France.

Since returning to competition in

Genetic evaluation

The importance of breeding values

A horse's performance ability is due to a combination of its genetic merit and a range of environmental influences, including its rider, training, feeding, etc. For breeding purposes, only the horse's genetic merit is important as this is a component that can be passed on to its offspring.

What is a genetic evaluation?

Genetic evaluation is a scientific objective and statistical assessment of the genetic merit of horses. The results are published as breeding values (BV) which are predictions of the genetic advantage that a horse will pass on to its offspring for a particular trait. A horse's breeding value measures the difference between its genetic ability and the average genetic ability of the population.

HSI carries out a genetic evaluation for showjumping horses in Ireland. Breeding values for showjumping ability at international level are produced. These measure the difference between each horse's genetic ability for international level showjumping and the average genetic ability for showjumping for the Irish population.

■ For publication, breeding values for stallions are divided into three groups

1. Stallions that have at least five competing Irish Sport Horse progeny that are at least 10 years of age. These stallions have had the opportunity to produce international level progeny. Their BVs are based mainly on their progeny's performance.

2. Stallions that have at least five competing Irish Sport Horse progeny that are at least four years of age. These stallions have progeny competing at national level but their progeny have not yet had the opportunity to compete internationally. The BVs for these stallions are based on a combination of progeny, own performance and pedigree information.

3. Stallions that do not have sufficient competing Irish Sport Horse progeny and are evaluated on the basis of their own performance. The BVs for these stallions are based on a combination of their own performance and pedigree. This group includes many recently classified stallions including young stallions that have been recently inspected.

Breeding values for mares are available to owners upon request.

How are breeding values calculated?

Three sources of information are used to calculate breeding values for international level showjumping ability: pedigree, own performance and progeny performance. Pedigree information for the genetic evaluation is supplied by the Irish Horse Register. Performance information is based on comprehensive national level information from the SJI database and international results collated by HSI from the FEI and other sources.

Pedigree information measures the showjumping ability of a horse's known relatives, including parents, full and half-siblings, grandparents, uncles, aunts, etc. The amount of emphasis placed on a relative's performance depends on how closely they are related. For example, breeding values of young stallions that have yet to compete are based solely on their pedigree. Their sire contributes 50% of their genes and, therefore, 50% of their breeding value. Breeding values based on pedigree alone are termed 'pedigree indexes' in HSI publications.

As stallions begin a competitive career, the emphasis shifts from their pedigree to their own performance. A stallion's own performance information is combined with his pedigree information to determine how much of his performance can be attributed to his genes and how much is due to environmental factors (e.g. rider, training). Breeding values based on own performances tell us if a horse is living up to the potential indicated by its pedigree.

The third source of information used in calculating the breeding values is progeny performance and the relative importance of pedigree and own performance decreases as more progeny are recorded in sport. Progeny information is the most reliable source of information in the genetic evaluation process. Breeding values are adjusted to take into account the quality of the mares that a stallion has been mated with. Breeding values based on progeny information tell us the degree to which a stallion has been a breed improver for international showjumping ability when crossed with Irish mares.

How do I interpret genetic evaluation results?

Breeding values are expressed as an index with an average value of 100. This baseline value of 100 reflects the average genetic merit of active breeding Irish Sport Horse mares born

between 1994 and 2008, and it enables comparisons between horses. Horses with breeding values of over 120 are considered to be of high genetic merit and are breed improvers. Horses with breeding values over 130 are considered to be superior breed improvers.

Breeding values are estimates of genetic merit, the true genetic merit of a horse can never be known exactly, as performances are affected by factors other than genetics. In addition, breeding values can change every year as more data becomes available, for example, as the number of a stallion's progeny competing increases. For these reasons, the reliability value should always be taken into account when interpreting breeding values.

The reliability value reflects the amount and type of information used in the calculation of a breeding value and can range from 0% to 100%. More information on a horse results in a higher reliability. Breeding values with a reliability of 90% or more are very reliable and are unlikely to change greatly. Breeding values with a low reliability are likely to change, either upwards or downwards, as more information becomes available. Breeding values with a reliability between 30% and 50% are considered to have a poor reliability. Breeding values with a reliability below 30% are not published.

Are breeding values published for thoroughbred and foreign-bred stallions?

Yes. However, in general, there is less information available on these stallions compared to Irish Sport Horses, as they tend to have very few relatives that have competed in Ireland. This leads to lower reliability values for these stallions.

Why should I refer to breeding values when choosing a stallion?

showjumping should be considered as a useful tool for breeders wishing to breed for the showjumping market. Irish Sport Horse stallions with breeding values greater than 130 will have over 20 times as many of their offspring competing at international level compared to the offspring of stallions with less than 100. Foals by stallions with breeding values above 130 achieve, on average, €445 more at auction than foals by stallions with breeding values below 100.

Breeders should view breeding values as a tool to assist in the selection of stallions. Other important factors such as conformation, movement, temperament and veterinary status, are not reflected in a stallion's breeding values for international level showjumping. It should also be noted that breeding values for international level showjumping do not indicate a stallion's ability in any other discipline, such as eventing or dressage. It is hoped that breeding values for eventing will be available in the near future, however, in the meantime, breeders may find stallion star rating information very useful when selecting stallions to produce horses for the eventing market.

Where can I find the breeding values of stallions?

They are published in the Stallion Book and are available on the HSI website www.horsesportireland.ie. Breeding values are published for stallions that have been classified or had progeny registered in the last three years and are included on the Irish Sport Horse Studbook Stallion list. This list includes current stallions classified as Approved (APP), Recognised (REC), Preliminary Approved (PA), Supplementary Approved (SA) or Preliminary Recognised (PR) in the Irish Sport Horse Studbook.

The market

Strong overseas attendance but

A welcome number of positives emerged from the sport horse sales of 2012, none less than the healthy attendance of overseas customers at every single fixture. Other positives included a glut of high prices across the age groups, each one greater than the corresponding figures from the previous year.

While this makes welcome reading, further analysis illustrates that the bulk of these headlining prices were received at the specialist event horse sales, and although several other individuals made an impact at sales across the country, the general overview was not so rosy.

Figures show that the current market was strong for the well-produced, older horse with form. The age group sold consistently well throughout the year, boasting the biggest clearance rates, along with the year's top price of €48,000. This honour, received at the Goresbridge Go for Gold Sale, fell to the event horse Tomgar Rembrandt, a six-year-old son of the Thoroughbred sire Easy Lift out of Kellyrose Lady (Daaman (TB)).

The younger age groups, however, revealed figures that were two-tier. While buyers were present in numbers

for the correct individual – and paid commercial prices – they were scarce and cautious for the numerically stronger remainder. This, in turn, left a complete absence of a middle market, which is unhealthy and a concern for the coming year. This trend was evident in the four-year-old age group but became even more marked at the three-year-old dispersals.

Road to profitability

Breeders face difficult decisions, but the year's returns offer firm indications of the road to profitability. Current trends clearly illustrate that

there is no market for younger plain horses. Every sale-topping horse was by a recognised sire, and all bar one were destined for the event track.

This lucrative market has opened the doors for the specialist event horse sales, which now dominate the annual returns.

The Goresbridge Go for Gold Sale, in particular, was responsible for the top ridden horse prices across the board, including the four-year-old SRS Quality at €28,000.

As his name suggests, this well-produced gelding was by the versatile OBOS Quality, a stallion also respon-

sible for the best priced three-year-old at €19,500. Sold in September at Goresbridge, the latter was a well-related gelding out of Simply Chic (Cruising) and a half brother to the international Grand Prix performer Credit Cruise and the Grade A Equality. Other good returns in the age group went to traditionally-bred sons of Cougar, Loughehoe Guy and Kings Master as well as a filly by Shannondale Sarco.

Reflecting on the past year, Martin Donohoe of Goresbridge said: "I've always said that if vendors give us what the market requires then we can sell them well – this was true of all our sales and highlighted further at the Go for Gold Sale last November. Building on that success we are aiming to make it better again this year."

While the tables show that the better prices fell to individuals with tradi-

tional and continental bloodlines, the foal sales portrayed an entirely different picture. Here, imported semen governed the market, although it was also noticeable that even these top prices have dropped for the third year in succession.

Stuart Clarke of Cavan Equestrian Centre said: "Our elite foal sale stayed a success, despite maybe dropping a little in average. This is almost certainly due to the current economic climate and the fact that the foal trade is largely a domestic market. Breeders have a tough job and definitely need to try to improve their mares. These days a mare needs pedigree and if she hasn't performed herself she needs to be correct and show some ability. Breeders also need to make a plan – decide what they are aiming to breed and when to market it."

In recent months, Horse Sport Ireland has been working on a new project to market Irish-bred horses abroad. The centre piece of this initiative will be the establishment of a dedicated website (working title: Irish Horse Gateway) where breeders and producers will be able to advertise and sell Irish horses in export markets.

One-stop shop

Horse Sport Ireland will then market this site worldwide as a 'one-stop shop' for buying Irish-bred horses.

It is intended that the website will be used to market any horse which is registered in a Studbook approved by the Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine, with recorded pedigree (sire and dam) verified by DNA.

Code of conduct

In order to ensure high standards, sellers using the Irish Horse Gateway will be required to sign a code of conduct and will receive guidance and training in uploading pictures and videos to the site.

The aim will be to present Ireland and the Irish horse in the most positive possible light.

Advice for the upcoming breeding season

HSI Voluntary Code of Practice

Horse Sport Ireland (HSI) advises that breeders should familiarise themselves with the HSI Voluntary Code of Practice for stallion and mare owners for the upcoming breeding season.

The code of practice outlines voluntary recommendations to help breeders, in conjunction with their veterinary surgeons, to prevent and control specific equine diseases.

The preventative measures included in the code of practice will help to increase fertility rates and reduce additional expenditure on covering and veterinary fees.

The HSI Voluntary Code of Practice outlines the following recommendations for mare owners:

- Prior to covering, mares should be tested for EVA and equine infectious anaemia (EIA) and should be swabbed for venereal pathogens.
- When choosing a stallion to cover your mare, enquire as to whether the stallion has been tested for these diseases.
- If importing semen, ensure that the semen is certified as EVA and pathogen free.
- Vaccinate all pregnant mares against equine herpesvirus (EHV).

Covering certificates

In order to avoid any untimely delays in registering foals, mare owners should ensure that they pay covering fees promptly and receive a covering certificate, which should then be sent to HSI.

It is also advisable to retain proof of payment for covering fees (copies of cheques, receipts, etc.).

owners may be helpful in the event of a dispute. Agreement between stallion and mare owners in relation to keep fees should also be reached prior to covering.

Register your foal

By law, foals must be registered before they reach six months of age. It should be noted that foals not identified before 31st December in their year of birth, or within six months following the date of birth (whichever date occurs later), are required to have their passports stamped as being not eligible for human consumption.

ISH Young Breeders' Programme 2013

The ISH Young Breeders' Programme is now in its seventh year since inception in 2005. It is a joint programme between Horse Sport Ireland and Teagasc, who are delighted to announce that Connolly's Red Mills will partner the programme for 2013. The programme is aimed at those aged 14-25 years (in 2013) who are interested in assessing, exhibiting and breeding performance horses. An avid interest and an eagerness to participate and learn is all that is required.

Developing skills for the breeders and producers of the future

This year will see the hosting of both National and World Championship Young Breeders' competitions. The nationals will take place at Kildalton Agricultural College, Piltown, Co. Kilkenny on 20 April. The World Championships will be held in Bolserup, Sweden from 12 to 14 July. Participation at the National competition is necessary to qualify for selection to represent the ISH Studbook at the World Championships. The top eight in both the 16-19 and 20-25 year age categories will go forward for further training and selection before the teams are selected for the World Championships at the end of June. Fourteen and 15-year-olds can compete at national level only.

The Young Breeders' Championships are based on five key areas:

- 1) Theory (stable management, the sport, breeding, feeding, health and welfare)
- 2) Assessment of conformation
- 3) Assessment of loose movement and loose jumping
- 4) Presentation of horses in hand using the triangle system
- 5) Turnout of horses

All of the above are important as a foundation for those with an interest in developing their knowledge of the horse. These skills come into focus for varied uses, including purchasing a new horse/pony; deciding about which mares/stallions to use for breeding; assessing offspring; presenting horses for inspection, sale, show or competition.

To ensure that participants are adequately prepared for competition a comprehensive training programme is in place preceding the National Young Breeders Championships:

Young people are encouraged to attend training days and become familiar with what's involved. Alongside the core principles of the competition, training days also focus on developing general knowledge through audiences with riders and industry professionals.

Arena party training

There is an opportunity for senior young breeders (18-25), who have actively attended training sessions, to partake in further training to become an arena party member for loose movement/jumping at HSI mare and stallion inspections. This aspect of training begins in the spring with Declan McArdle of Teagasc. Participants are trained in all aspects of arena party activity. Suc-

cessful candidates can achieve FETAC minor award accreditation. The training is integrated with the HSI mare inspections and to get on the panel participants must pass an exam. To remain on the panel they must complete an annual refresher course. The bonus is that candidates are paid a fee for their work at inspections.

Irish Breeders' Classic

Bens Lady Lux (ISH) wins the inaugural Irish Breeders' Classic

Breeder Ann Marie Blessington of Tober, Granard, Co. Longford, won the inaugural Irish Breeders' Classic top breeder's prize for producing Bens Lady Lux (ISH) 2007, brown mare by Lux Z (HANN) out of Leading Edge (ISH) by Cavalier Royale (HOLST). Bens Lady Lux (ISH) was ridden to victory by Harry Marshall at this showcase for Irish-born horses, held in Barnadown, Co. Wexford in September last year.

World's richest young horse class

The Irish Breeders' Classic is a showjumping competition for five and six-year-old Irish-born horses, with a total prize fund of €50,000, making it the richest young horse class in the world. Five percent of the overall prize fund went to breeders, with the winning breeder's prize of €1,000 provided by Horse Sport Ireland. The prize fund is generated by voluntary contributions from organisations and individuals within the Irish Sport Horse industry. Last year's competition was a huge success, with 86 entries and 30 combinations making it through to the final. Competitors included Cian O'Connor (Olympic Bronze medallist), Francis Connors (10 times National Champion) and Greg Broderick (highest ranked Irish rider). The event was streamed live on www.livestream.ie and is still available to view on www.irishbreedersclassic.com. Horse & Country TV aired the competition and footage of the winning round was aired on RTE Six One News.

The aim of the Irish Breeders' Classic is to make it viable for people to invest in an Irish-born sport horse to compete, in turn, creating demand for horses bred by Irish breeders. The competition mirrors the product that racing offers an owner. Instead of producing a horse over several years to international level with top prize funds, an owner can purchase an Irish-born sport horse and have an opportunity of winning a top prize in a shorter space of time.

HSI CEO Damian McDonald commented: "After its successful inauguration, I'm sure this event will be here to stay. The industry owes a debt of gratitude to organiser Ronan Rothwell who had the courage to take on this project and make it such a success. Barnadown also did a fantastic job."
