- Classes must be held in an arena with a suitable surface to allow handlers demonstrate in hand movement.
- Shows cannot schedule or hold other young handler classes as part of the show.
- Entry fees for the classes cannot exceed €20.

The following are some of the responsibilities of the venues selected to host a class for the HSI Young Handler Championship Series:

- Promoting the class
- Taking entries for the class
- Providing HSI with a complete list of entries a week prior to the class
- Holding the class in a prominent area with a suitable surface to cope with adverse conditions
- Preparing the ring with a triangle/flowers and having three lunge whips available on the day
- Having an office or sheltered tent close to the arena
- Providing a steward for the class to assist with the call up of competitors and to ensure that all animals are led into and out of the ring
- Ensuring adequate health and safety measures are in place for the class
- Providing a commentator/announcer for the class with suitable knowledge and experience
- Providing a photographer for the class
- Venues should ensure that their own insurers are aware they are holding the classes and should supply HSI with confirmation that they have suitable cover in place with an appropriate limit of indemnity (approx. EUR 6,500,000) and that their policy includes a Principals Clause.

The factors listed below will be taken into consideration when selecting venues for the 2019 Championship:

- \*Suitable date and location.
- Established shows with suitable facilities to cater for a young handler class.
- Avoidance of clashes with other shows.
- On-site facilities for participants and spectators.

\*Note that there will be 5 regional qualifiers, one held in each of the IHB electoral regions where possible. Qualifiers will be held between June and August, the final will take place at the National Ploughing Championships.
