Equine Premises Number - It is a legal requirement under the Control on Places where Horses are kept Regulations (SI 113 of 2014) that all premises where equines are kept must be registered with the Department of Agriculture. Accordingly, you should ensure that your equine is being kept on a registered premises. If your holding is not already registered as an Equine Premises, you should apply immediately to DAFM for an Equine Premises Number.

Further points to note:

- 1.The passport is not a deed of ownership
- 2.This document is a legal declaration (with penalties under the Animal Health and Welfare Act 2013.)
- 3.It is a legal requirement that the document of Identification (passport) should always accompany the equine.
