



## Horse Sport Ireland - End of Year Review

### National Equine Anti-Doping Programme Summary 2019

The period under review in this report is 1st January 2019 – 31st December 2019. During this time the Irish Equestrian Federation Equine Anti-Doping Programme carried out 127 tests.
