Selection Policy for Irish Sport Horses (ISH) & Irish Warmbloods (WSI)

WBFSH Quota

FEI WBFSH World Breeding Jumping Championships for Young Horses 2020

CH-M-YH-S Lanaken, BEL

15 – 20 September 2020

Important Notice:

At the time of publication, the FEI WBFSH World Breeding Jumping Championships for Young Horses 2019 is scheduled to go ahead. However, athletes, producers, breeders, owners and all relevant stakeholders should be mindful that the COVID 19 pandemic continues to evolve in Ireland and across Europe. As such, the Championships may be cancelled at late notice, which will lead to disappointment across the equestrian community but also undoubtedly financial loss for stakeholders. Horse Sport Ireland wish to remind stakeholders that where such cancellation occurs that same is not within the control of the IRL NF and it follows that Horse Sport Ireland cannot be held responsible for losses howsoever arising, indirect or otherwise.

The below selection policy is based on the current knowledge of Horse Sport Ireland. Any changes will be publicised through the HSI website and social media platforms.

SECTION I TIMELINES

1.1 The selection timelines for the CH-M-YH-S are as follows:

Week commencing 17th August 2020	The Lanaken Chef D'Equipe/ Championship Selector, Comdt. John Ledingham will formally select the combinations in the respective age categories - 5,6,7 year olds – subject to FEI quota allocations available.
Week commencing 17 th August 2020	Selected combinations will be required to complete FEI Registration immediately prior to Definite Entries.
AS per FEI Schedule	Horse Sport Ireland will submit the Definite Entries to the FEI.

SECTION II ELIGIBILITY FOR SELECTION

- 2.1 An FEI maximum of 18 horses (based on 2019 schedule) shall be selected to represent the Irish WBFSH Studbooks at the FEI World Breeding Jumping Championships for Young Horses. For the avoidance of doubt, the Irish WBFSH Studbooks are the Irish Sport Horse Studbook (ISH) and the Warmblood Studbook of Ireland (WSI).
- 2.2 All horses must be registered in a Studbook, which is a full member of the WBFSH. Only the Studbook in which the horse in question is first registered, is acceptable for participation at the Championships.
- 2.3 Eligible horses will be selected irrespective of their riders' nationality.
- 2.4 Eligible horses will be selected irrespective of their country of birth.
- 2.5 Breeding criteria: All horses registered in the Irish Sport Horse Studbook with the breed code ISH, and with sire and dam recorded on their passport, and all horses registered in the Warmblood Studbook of Ireland with the breed code WSI, and with sire and dam recorded on their passport, are eligible for selection.

SECTION III WBFSH Quota Agreement/ OC WILDCARDS

- 3.1 Athletes, Owners, Personal Management teams should familiarise themselves with the FEI/WBFSH/ OC Agreement in respect of NF quotas and wildcards.
- 3.2 For the IRL NF, a maximum of **7 horses** will be the quota in each of the following age categories:
 - 5 year olds;
 - 6 year olds;
 - 7 year olds;

3.2 FEI Schedule for the Championships provides for the respective countries quota as noted below:

SECTION IV VETERINARY

- 4.1 Horse Sport Ireland can request that a horse be made available for inspection by the Team Veterinarian(s) or an appointed Veterinarian at any time. Athletes must comply with this request.
- 4.2 Athletes must notify the Championship Selector, Comdt John Ledingham of any change in their horse's health status or of any veterinary issues when they first become apparent;
- 4.3 Horse Sport Ireland can send the Team Veterinarian or an appointed Veterinarian to take a blood and/or urine sample from a horse at any time, for the purposes of testing for prohibited substances, and/or as part of an assessment of the horse's well-being;
- 4.4 Athletes (at their own expense), shall make available, upon the request of the Team Veterinarian or an appointed Veterinarian, the veterinary records of horse(s) being considered for selection. In addition, athletes, (at their own expense), shall be responsible for supplying any follow-up diagnostic information requested by the Team Veterinarian for horses being considered for selection. Failure to comply with any request of the Team Veterinarian or an appointed Veterinarian may result in the removal of the athlete/horse combination from selection.
- 4.5 Each athlete will be required to keep a medication log book for their horses in which they shall record all products, treatments, foodstuffs and supplements used on or given to their horse from 1st July 2019 until the conclusion of the CH-EU- S.
- 4.6 The Team Veterinarian will be entitled to view this log book at any time. Athletes are required to submit this log book (in strict confidence) together with the Medication and Anti-Doping Control Declaration (Appendix 3) to the Team Veterinarian for assessment on or before the FEI Final Definite Entries [date to be confirmed] in line with Rule 8.12 of the Horse Sport Ireland General Rules.
- 4.7 In the event that treatments and medications are necessary subsequent to the submission of the logbook, express approval is required from Team Veterinarian and the Championship Selector, Comdt. John Ledingham. This is a mandatory requirement to ensure that selected horses are managed appropriately within the pre-competition window and before departure.

SECTION V SPECIFIC SELECTION CRITERIA

- 5.1 The primary aim of this criteria is to select athlete and horse combinations who are capable of achieving podium finishes in each of respective age categories at the FEI WBFSH World Breeding Jumping Championships for Young Horses 2019.
- 5.2 The following criteria shall be used for selection of the age categories:

5 Year Old Category

- 5.2.1 The six quota places will be allocated by the Championship Selector based on the competition and general measures outlined at section 5.4 and 5.5 below.
- 5.2.2 (2) Non-Travelling reserves will be selected in the 5 year old. Such reserves will be listed in ranking order and will be invited to travel in the event of selected combination unable to travel.

6 Year Old Category

- 5.2.3 Seven quota places will be allocated by the Championship Selector based on the competition and general measures outlined at section 5.4 and 5.5 below.
- 5.2.4 (2) Non-Travelling reserves will be selected in the 6 year old category. Such reserves will be listed in ranking order and will be invited to attend in the event of selected combination unable to travel.

7 Year Old Category

- 5.2.5 Five quota places will be allocated by the Championship Selector based on the competition and general measures outlined at section 5.4 and 5.5 below.
 - 5.2.6 (2) Non-Travelling reserves will be selected in the 6 year old category. Such reserves will be listed in ranking order and will be invited to travel in the event of combination unable to travel.
- 5.4 In assessing the performance of combinations, the Championship Selector will give consideration to the performances in 2020 at the following events:
- 5.4.1 Showjumping Ireland national events inclusive of all relevant age classes;
 - 5.4.2 FEI designated events in Ireland and abroad inclusive of relevant age classes;
 - 5.4.3 All relevant competitions approved by other National Federations;
- 5.5 In assessing the performance of all combinations, the Championship Selector will give consideration to the following general measures. These measures include, but are not limited to:
- 5.5.1 An athlete's form on other horses may also be taken into consideration;
 - 5.5.2 the suitability of the Combination with regard to the likely characteristics of the arenas in Lanaken and for the unexpected conditions of the CH-M-YH-S (taking into account the objective of the of this Policy)
 - 5.5.3 the ability of the Athlete and his/her support team to operate and perform in a FEI championship environment which is highly regulated & pressurised;
 - 5.5.4 the ability of the Athlete and/or support team to contribute towards an effective team and winning orientated environment;
 - 5.5.5 the overall balance of the Combinations that have been selected;
 - 5.5.6 the ability and experience of the Combination to compete successfully at a high level of international competition;
 - 5.5.7 demonstrated experience and/ or success at Championship level; the ability, or potential ability, of a Horse and/or Athlete to perform under the stress and pressure of a FEI World Championships;
 - 5.5.8 the ability of the Athlete, and/or their personal management team to prepare their Horse to peak condition for a major campaign, such as the FEI Championship;
 - 5.5.9 Overall form of the combinations under similar conditions (e.g. similar time allowed, water fences, light fence material, width of oxers) to those that will be met at Lanaken;

- 5.5.10 consistency of performance and the likelihood of a suitable performance to contribute towards a team medal outcome may be a consideration;
- 5.6 The Championship Selector will consider section 5.5.6 in the following guise:
- i. Success individually;
 - ii. Personal bests at targeted competitions;
 - iii. Taking ownership of their performances;
 - iv. Being willing to make change and develop;
 - v. Commitment to excellent horsemanship;
 - vi. Have personal coaches, individual performance plans, personal fitness structures and horse management programmes in place;
- 5.7 The soundness of the horse to meet the challenges of competing and travelling to the CH-M-YH-S Lanaken, BEL. will be a significant factor in any selection decision. Athletes must keep the Championship Selector fully briefed on any health or soundness issues the horse may have both historically and throughout the Season. From the date of selection, all squad members must immediately inform the Championship Selector and Team Veterinarian(s) of any illness or injury (however minor). Where it becomes apparent that a squad horse is unsound, and/or that there was a non-disclosure relating to soundness, the Championship Selector reserves the right to remove that combination from selection with immediate effect. The decision of the Championship Selector advice from the Team Veterinarian is final.
- 5.8 Prior and subsequent to selection, the Championship Selector may undertake regular evaluations as to the combinations standard of fitness, their progress in training, their preparedness for the event and their form. Any advices provided by the Team Veterinarian, and medical professionals may be utilised by the Championship Selector, where required. However, such evaluations shall be discretionary on the part of the Selector.
- 5.9 Furthermore, the Championship Selector shall have the authority to remove a selected horse/athlete combination from Selection, inclusive of horses who have obtained their place pursuant to Articles, 5.2.1, 5.2.4, and 5.2.7 where the selected horse and/or athlete has not maintained their fitness, standard of performance, or any other performance related matter in which the Championship Selector considers important, which is not a standard comparable to that exhibited so as to gain selection to represent Ireland at the CH-M-YH-S Lanaken, BEL.
- 5.10 The Championship Selector's decision in respect of selected combinations is final and binding.

SECTION VI FORCE MAJEURE

- 6.1 In considering the performances of athletes at events or other attendances in line with this policy, the Championship Selector may, at his discretion, give weight to extenuating circumstances.
- 6.2 For the purposes of section 6.1 above, extenuating circumstances means an inability to compete, or perform at an optimum level arising from:
- i. Injury or illness;
 - ii. Bereavement or personal misfortune, and/or;
 - iii. Any other factors reasonably considered by the Championship Selector to constitute extenuating circumstances;

- 6.3 Athletes unable to compete at camps, events, trials or other attendances required under this policy must advise the Championship Selector by email of this fact and the reasons thereof as soon as practicable after the extenuating circumstances arise.
- 6.4 In the case of injury or illness, athletes may be required to undergo a medical examination by a doctor or doctor (s) nominated by Horse Sport Ireland. The Championship Selector reserves his right to remove an athlete where the designated medical officer deems the athlete unfit to compete, at the level which resulted in their selection for CH-EU- S.
- 6.5 A decision in each case of extenuating circumstances will be made by the Championship Selector on a case by case basis.
- 6.6 Post Selection, Athlete substitutions will normally not be allowed except on medical or veterinary grounds, but all substitution decisions will be at the discretion of the Championship Selector. In the case of a bona fide sale, where an Athlete substitution is requested, the Championship Selector reserves all rights in respect of granting the substitution request.

SECTION VII REMOVAL OF ATHLETES

- 7.1 An athlete shall be removed from squad selection (individual or team) non- travelling reserve selection, FEI Nominated Entries and FEI Final Entries by the Championship Selector pursuant clause 4.6, 5.6, 5.8 & 6.4 above;
- 7.2 An athlete may be removed from squad shortlisting & selection (individual or team), non- travelling reserve selection, FEI Nominated Entries and/or FEI Final Entries for any of the following reasons, as determined by Horse Sport Ireland Sport Panel;
 - i. Notification of an adverse analytical finding following on from testing pursuant to the FEI & HSI Equine Anti-Doping Rules and Equine Controlled Medication Rules & FEI & Sport Ireland Human Anti-Doping Protocols;
 - ii. Violation of the FEI & HSI Equine Anti-Doping Rules and Equine Controlled Medication Rules & FEI & Sport Ireland Human Anti-Doping Protocols;
 - iii. Violation of the FEI Hypersensitivity Protocol;
 - iv. Violation or alleged violation of the FEI Sport Rules and Regulations, HSI General Rules and/or Policies;
 - v. Violation or alleged violation of the HSI Code of Conduct and Jumping Programme Participation Agreement.
 - vi. Any action which could damage the reputation of the Sport or the Country;
- 7.3 Pursuant to Section 7 above, the Championship Selector's decision is final and binding.

SECTION VIII DISCLAIMERS

- 8.1 These procedures are based on FEI General Regulations and applicable FEI Sport Rules as presently known and understood. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to HSI. However, the selections are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency.
- 8.2 As such, this policy can be amended at any time by Horse Sport Ireland. Horse Sport Ireland reserves the right to amend or change the Selection Policy where necessary at any time in order to fulfil the objective of the Selection Policy. In the event, that

Horse Sport Ireland is of the opinion that such an amendment is necessary as a result of any change in any of the above stated rules, regulations and agreements, to give effect to the policy following discovery of a drafting error or oversight or for any other reason determined to be in the best interests of Horse Sport Ireland. Horse Sport Ireland shall not be responsible or liable in any way to anyone as a result of any such amendment.
