

HSI Three and Four-Year-Old Loose-Jumping

Filly Competitions

Three venues – Open to horses

One venue – Open to ponies

Criteria and Scoring System

These competitions are for three and four-year-old fillies and aim to identify young performance fillies that may be suitable for the breeding herd. By entering you provide consent to have your filly linear profiled for research at these events. The competitions are open to any three or four-year-old horse that is registered in a DAFM approved Studbook or WBFSH Studbook.

A pony loose jumping competition will run at Creagh Equestrian Centre on Monday 12th October and the horse competitions will run at Tubberbride Equestrian Centre on Tuesday 13th October, Cavan Equestrian Centre on Tuesday 20th October and Topflight Equestrian Centre on Monday 26th October.

The pony competition is open to any three and four-year-old pony that is registered in an EU Studbook. For the loose jumping pony competition there will be a height restriction based on the measurement of the height at the withers which cannot exceed a maximum of 151.0cm with shoes on the day of competition.

Passports must be available for inspection by staff and judges at the competitions. Prize money will not be paid to fillies that do not meet the registration requirements.

Scoring for the horse section will include pedigree points based on the performances of the filly's pedigree.

Please note: Only pedigree and performance information supplied by the entrant will be included in the assessment of the pedigree score. The onus is on the entrant to supply full performance details for the damline (dam, maternal granddam and maternal great granddam and their progeny) to HSI by the closing date.


Only information provided by the closing date for entries will be verified and included in the calculations of the pedigree score at the competition.

If no pedigree and performance information is supplied by the entrant by the closing date, horses will receive a pedigree score of 0.

Performance pedigree of horses will be assessed by the studbook prior to the class based on the information provided in the online application. The score for pedigree will be based on whether the sire has been successful at CSI5* Grand Prix level (or equivalent in other disciplines or via his progeny) and the highest level at which a relative is successful for 3 generations of the dam line.

In this regard, detailed information on performing horses must be provided to ensure that appropriate points are awarded to your entry. HSI will not be responsible in instances where sufficient details are not supplied. Details considered include the horse's studbook name and competition name, studbook, year, sex, sire name, rider, competition organiser, show name, class name, level (e.g. fence height, format) and date, horse's placing and/or score. **A link or photo of the relative's performance record from a studbook or sporting organisation is sufficient** (e.g. FEI, SJI, EI, BSJA, British Eventing or equivalents in other countries). For stallions, their full name and breed is sufficient.

In this regard, supporting documentation from the relevant national (or international) sporting body verifying the performance claimed, must be provided or available online to ensure that appropriate points are awarded to your entry. HSI will not be responsible in instances where supporting documentation is not available.

Points for:	Pedigree Points
Sire successful at CSI5* Grand Prix or equivalent	5
Dam	Up to 10
maternal granddam or maternal great granddam	Up to 10 (maternal granddam) <i>Or</i> Up to 5 (maternal great granddam)
Maximum Points Available	25

The points awarded for each of these dams will be based on the individual's mare's own performance or its progeny's performance component of the star rating criteria, whichever is highest. A performing horse may only be counted once either as a dam or as a sibling.

For example, a foal whose dam is eligible for a 4 star rating for her own showjumping performance and a 3 star rating for her progeny's showjumping performance will be considered to be a 4 star mare out of an available 5 stars. Her foal will receive 4 points for this dam.

Where pedigree points are available for a dam they will be awarded as follows:

Horses or Ponies may enter competitions, however if a prize is won at any competition, you will not be permitted to compete at a further competition.

In the event of a tie, the horse or pony with the highest score for 'Technique' will be the winner.

Horses and ponies may be called back into the arena to jump a bigger fence before the final adjudication at the judge's discretion.
