



HSI Colt Retention Scheme 2023

Horse Sport Ireland (HSI) are delighted to launch a colt retention scheme for breeders/owners of young colts aged 2 years old who wish to go forwards for studbook inspection. This scheme is funded by the Department of Agriculture, Food, and the Marine (DAFM) by National Breeding Services. The scheme is open to colts who are registered in a DAFM approved studbook or are listed as bred in Ireland in their passport and registered in a studbook and meet the specific requirements outlined below. Breeders/owners will have the opportunity to apply to participate in the colt retention scheme by completing an online application. Successful applicants are eligible to receive up to €2000 towards the retention costs of the colt over a 3-month period. Please see the table below for relevant deadlines.

Ponies are also eligible to receive funding under the scheme but must also meet the criteria and be registered/endorsed in a DAFM Approved Pony Studbook.

This scheme has two main objectives:

1. To encourage owners and breeders to retain and breed from colts which are of high genetic merit or descended from rare bloodlines.
2. To identify potential breeding colts in advance of studbook inspection and support their breeders/owners to retain them for future studbook selection.

- Applicants must submit proof (screenshot) of their 2023 census submission, including the year and the number of horses to be eligible to participate.
- Colts must meet the following eligibility criteria:
 - They must be DAFM studbook registered/WBFSH studbook registered **and** Irish bred.
 - The sires must be Approved/Recognised in DAFM/WBFSH Approved studbook **OR** be Class 1 and deemed Rare for native/rare breeds.
 - The colt must have a dam or maternal sister competing at/meets 3* criteria or above, **OR** an EBV ≥130.
See Appendix 1 below.
 - For native/rare breeds (Irish Draughts, Kerry Bog Ponies, Connemara Ponies)
The colt must have a kinship value of less than 1.25 (i.e., be from a rare bloodline), or in the case of Connemara ponies, be designated as a rare/threatened line by the CPBS.
- Owners must submit a veterinary letter confirming the colt is entire.
- Applicants must be the registered owner of the animal at the point of application and must be residing on the island of Ireland.
- For inclusion of equines registered in dual ownership, permission in written or email correspondence must be received by HSI from the non-applicant owner. Scheme approval/payment of prize funds will not occur in the absence of this written or email permission.



- Applicants may apply for up to two colts.
- A hair sample from the colt must be submitted for genotyping.
- Owners of approved colts must release permission to the colts genotype (if not existing in HSI) for the purposes of research into traits and breed improvement.
- Receipted expenses for the retention costs of the colt must be submitted to HSI before the **25th of September 2023.**
- Eligible expenses may include but are not limited to:
 - Grass livery
 - Feed (concentrates)
 - Dentistry/farrier/veterinary
 - Handling training
- Payment will not be issued until receipt of valid copy of the invoices, receipts and video evidence of the colt leading up in-hand.
- All applications must be completed online.
- Video evidence must be provided via the online portal of the colt leading up in-hand in 2023.
- This scheme will operate on a first come first served basis up to the maximum allocation facilitated by the existing budget allocation. Horse Sport Ireland reserves the right to close the scheme ahead of the advertised deadline.
- Ownership of the animal cannot be changed between family members for the purpose of entering the scheme.
- Horse Sport Ireland reserve the right to change, amend or update scheme terms and conditions. In the event of same, existing applicants will be notified.
- Horse Sport Ireland reserves the right to use performance equivalents and will consider breeding values from other studbooks on a case-by-case basis.
- Horse Sport Ireland reserves the right to reject any application.
- Incomplete applications will not be assessed, the onus is on the applicant to provide HSI with all the required detail and evidence of verified performance/classification.
- Horse Sport Ireland will provide the results of this scheme, where relevant, to the studbook of origin of the equine in question.
- If the colt is kept at livery:
 - The applicants must be satisfied as to the skills, knowledge, experience and facilities of their selected keeper to care for their horse appropriately.
 - The applicant and keeper are responsible for all insurance costs and liability for both horse and producer i.e., to cover any personal accident/injury and or horse accident/injury. Horse Sport Ireland will not be liable for any damages or losses incurred by applicants or producers during the training period.
 - Horse Sport Ireland will not be party to any contracts or agreements entered or between breeders/owners and producers.
 - Horse Sport Ireland will have no role to play in the event of any disputes between breeders/owners and producers arising from participation in this scheme.



- Applicants must be prepared to provide Horse Sport Ireland with a Tax clearance certificate should the sum of their approvals and or prize money equal €10,000 or more. If a tax clearance cert cannot be furnished on request, grants cannot be provided.
