



HSI Mare X-Ray Screening Scheme 2023

Horse Sport Ireland (HSI) are delighted to launch an x-ray screening scheme for breeders/owners of young fillies/mares aged 2-5 years old. This scheme is funded by the Department of Agriculture, Food, and the Marine (DAFM) by National Breeding Services. The scheme is open to fillies/mares who are registered/endorsed in a DAFM approved studbook and meet specific requirements. Breeders/owners will have the opportunity to apply to participate in the x-ray screening scheme by completing an online application. Following receipt of a valid application which is subsequently approved, HSI will cover the cost of the screening (up to €350 ex vat) and notify the selected HSI approved veterinarian. Please see the table below for relevant deadlines.

Ponies are also eligible to receive funding under the scheme but must also meet the performance criteria and be registered/endorsed in an EU/DAFM Approved Pony Studbook.

This scheme has three objectives:

1. Provide breeders with an accessible x-ray screening programme for their own personal use in benchmarking their breeding herd.
2. Document the prevalence osteo-abnormalities the degree of bony changes in the Irish young horse population.
3. Use the data as a benchmark for bony changes in the Irish herd and disseminate this information in a scientific journal/scientific conference(s).

* Tranche two will only open if the allocation has not been filled during Tranche one. Applicants approved in T1 must return their invoices before the T1 deadline. T1 invoices will not be accepted in T2.					

- Fillies/Mares must meet the following eligibility criteria:
 - Be 2-5 years old and registered/endorsed in a DAFM approved studbook.
 - Provide verified results demonstrating the performance criteria outlined below (female relatives only):
 - Dam, sister or granddam of the young horse must be a 2-star or above mare based either on her own performance or on the performance of her progeny. **OR**
 - mare who is the subject of the application has an HSI estimated breeding value or pedigree index for show jumping of 120 or above. Breeding values for mares are available to their owners and breeders on request from HSI by emailing genetics@horsesportireland.ie. **OR**



- Irish Draught mares/filles by Class 1 stallions out of Class 1 dams
- Sires must have an Approved/Preliminary Approved or Recognised/Preliminary Recognised classification/Class 1 in a WBFSH/DAFM-Approved studbook.
- Equivalent pony performance criteria including but not limited to:
 - Two DC/top 10% performance in at an officially recorded class/event as follows:
 - 128A - 1.00m - 1.10m
 - 138A – 1.10m - 1.20m
 - 148A – 1.20m - 1.30m
 - CCIP
 - CCI1*

Prior to completion of x-rays the applicant is required to provide;

- Evidence of WBFSH/DAFM stallion classification OR Class 1 classification
 - Evidence of 2-star performance/progeny performance for the dam
 - Evidence of ownership of the animal

- The equine must be resident on the island of Ireland (inc. Northern Ireland).
 - Applicants must be the registered owner of the animal at the point of application.
 - For inclusion of equines registered in dual ownership, permission in written or email correspondence must be received by HSI from the non-applicant owner. Scheme approval/ payment of prize funds will not occur in the absence of this written or email permission.
 - Applicants may apply for up to two mares/fillies.
 - Animals must be registered/endorsed in a DAFM-approved studbook.
 - In 2024, the mare will be required to be inspected in a DAFM Approved studbook.
 - This scheme will operate on a first come first served basis up to the maximum allocation facilitated by the existing budget allocation. Horse Sport Ireland reserves the right to close the scheme ahead of the advertised deadline.
 - Horse Sport Ireland reserve the right to change, amend or update scheme terms and conditions. In the event of same, existing applicants will be notified.
 - Horse Sport Ireland reserves the right to use performance equivalents and will consider breeding values from other studbooks on a case-by-case basis.
 - Horse Sport Ireland reserves the right to reject any application.
 - Incomplete applications will not be assessed, the onus is on the applicant to provide HSI with all of the required detail and evidence of verified performance/classification.
 - HSI will pay the approved veterinarian directly and receive each animals' x-rays directly from the clinic.
 - The veterinarian will not provide any 'live' interpretation of the x-rays to the applicant on the day of screening.
 - X-rays will be interpreted and scored by a HSI expert x-ray panel.
 - Applicants will receive a digital copy of the X-rays & interpretation directly from HSI.
 - All x-ray images will be retained by HSI for research purposes. This research will not publish any identifiable features of the animals/owners/breeders who participated in the scheme.



- Horse Sport Ireland will provide the results of this scheme, where relevant, to the studbook of origin of the equine in question.
- This screening is solely for the purpose of documenting the incidence of a variety of orthopaedic conditions; these x-rays do not provide recommendation for subsequent suitability for sale.
- I confirm that I have reviewed Horse Sport Ireland's Data Protection and Privacy policies (available at www.horsesportireland.ie or on request) and I note that HSI only process personal data for legitimate business purposes and/or where required by law. All processing will have due regard to the DPA 2018 and GDPR 2016. I note that HSI and selected/approved veterinary clinics will honour the rights and freedoms of the data subjects at all times, as long as there is no other overriding law which limits those privileges.
