

Premium Mare Retention Scheme 2024

Horse Sport Ireland (HSI) are delighted to re-launch the premium mare retention scheme for breeders of young high merit mares aged 5-7 years old. This scheme is funded by the Department of Agriculture, Food, and the Marine (DAFM) by National Breeding Services. It is vital to encourage breeders to retain and breed from high merit performance mares. The Premium Mare Retention Scheme focuses on the support for breeders to professionally produce mares which they do not have the capacity to do themselves. This scheme subsidises production costs of young high-performance mares which can be retained for future breeding.

The scheme is open to mares who are classified in a DAFM approved studbook. Mares must meet the specific requirements outlined below. Successful applicants are eligible to receive up to €6,000 towards the retention costs of the mare over a 5-month period. Please see the table below for relevant deadlines.

Pony mares are also eligible to receive funding under the scheme but must also meet equivalent pony criteria and be classified/categorised in a DAFM Approved Pony Studbook (Appendix 1.)

This scheme has two main objectives:

1. To encourage owners and breeders to retain, produce and breed from mare which are of high genetic merit or descended from rare bloodlines.
2. To identify potential premium mares and enable breeders to produce them, and potentially breed from them, and in doing so add value to the mares and the breeder's breeding herd.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS – General terms:

- Applicants must submit proof (screenshot) of their 2023 census submission, including the year and the number of horses to be eligible to participate.
- All applications must be completed online.
- This scheme will operate on a first come first served basis up to the maximum allocation facilitated by the existing budget allocation. Horse Sport Ireland reserves the right to close the scheme ahead of the advertised deadline.
- Horse Sport Ireland reserve the right to change, amend or update scheme terms and conditions. In the event of same, existing applicants will be notified.
- Horse Sport Ireland reserves the right to use performance equivalents and will consider breeding values from other studbooks on a case-by-case basis.
- Horse Sport Ireland reserves the right to reject any application.
- Incomplete applications will not be assessed, the onus is on the applicant to provide HSI with all the required detail and evidence of verified performance/classification & producer expertise.
- Horse Sport Ireland will provide the results of this scheme, where relevant, to the studbook of origin of the equine in question.

- Applicant and horse application data will be shared with the relevant studbook to confirm breed, studbook, ownership, and any other relevant eligibility for application processing.
- All applications must be submitted before the above stated deadlines. **Invoices after the above deadlines will not be funded.** This deadline will not be extended, and no late submissions will be accepted.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS – Equine eligibility:

- Mares must meet the following eligibility criteria:
 - They must be DAFM approved studbook classified (inspected).
 - The mare's sire must be Preliminary Approved/Approved/recognised in DAFM/WBFSH Approved studbook.
 - **5-year-old mares** must have a dam or a sister (dam line) competing up to 3* (Appendix 3) or an estimated breeding value (EBV) >130
OR
2 Double Clears to date in DAFM Studbook Series (show jumping), DAFM Studbook Series Eventing MER/equivalent based on class articles (Appendix 5).
 - **6/ 7-year-old mares** must have competed in the DAFM Studbook Series (show jumping or Eventing/equivalent (equivalent based on the class articles – Appendix 5.) recorded classes in the previous year (2 Showjumping Double Clear/1 Eventing MER)
 - The mare must be campaigned in **at least two** of the Show jumping/Eventing DAFM Studbook Series or their equivalents (based on class article) over the duration of the funding allocation.
 - Dressage mares will be supported based on their equivalent performance criteria.
 - Trotter/pacer studbook mares will be assessed against the criteria outlined in appendix 1.
- Mares that have been funded in the 2024 Schooling I or Schooling II Scheme are not eligible to be funded in the Premium Mare Retention Scheme, and vice versa.
- Mares that have been funded in the 2023 Premium Mare Retention Scheme are eligible to take part in the 2024 Premium Mare Retention Scheme if the applicant can provide a veterinary certificate stating that the mare had a successful embryo transfer in 2023 for a foal due in 2024.
- Mares must be inspected by a DAFM approved Studbook in 2024 if not already inspected.
 - Mares who are approved onto the scheme but DO NOT present for inspection/classification, will have their approval rescinded.
- Approved mares are eligible to receive up to €6,000 towards the mare if retained over a 5-month period.
- Video evidence must be provided via the online portal of the mare in one of these production classes in 2024 and a valid record of their result(s)
- If the mare is injured or unable to be ridden owing to another welfare reason HSI must be advised immediately and the fund will only be paid up to the date of injury. The applicant must provide veterinary proof.
- A hair sample from the mare must be submitted for genotyping, if she has not been genotyped.



- Approved mares must release permission to their genotype (if not existing in HSI) for the purposes of research into traits and breed improvement.
- Mares approved in this scheme will have automatic approval under the x-ray and embryo transfer schemes, mares that have not previously been x-rayed must be screened under the HSI screening protocol*.
 - * if x-rays have been previously taken they must be labelled to identify the horse and submitted. Otherwise, the age criteria in the x-ray scheme does not apply to mares approved under this scheme and they gain entry for screening. The x-ray screening would be funded through the x-ray screening scheme allocation.
 - Mares are not obliged to complete an embryo transfer but are encouraged to do so via the ET scheme. In future, an embryo or foal from the mare may be a requirement of the scheme.
 - Mares on the Premium Mare Retention Scheme will only be approved for the ET Scheme provided the application is made before the ET Scheme reaches capacity.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS – Applicant:

- Applicants must be the registered breeder and owner of the animal at the point of application and must reside on the island of Ireland (inc Northern Ireland).
 - For inclusion of equines registered in dual ownership/breed partnership permission in written or email correspondence must be received by HSI from the non-applicant owner. Scheme approval will not occur in the absence of this written or email permission.
- IBANs provided for scheme payment **MUST** be the IBAN of the applicant, not the producer or any other applicant.
- Receipted expenses for the retention costs of the mare must be submitted to HSI **before the 2nd October 2024**. This deadline will not be extended, and no late submissions will be accepted.
- Eligible expenses may include but are not limited to:
 - Professional production livery
 - Feed/supplement costs
 - Dentistry/farrier/veterinary/chiropractor
 - Entry fees/Schooling Fees
- Payment will not be issued until receipt of valid copy of the invoices, receipts and video evidence of the young horse's progress.
 - All receipts/invoices must clearly indicate: Company/supplier name and address, receipt ID number, date of issue, date of payment, horse details (name/UELN/Chip number) itemised breakdown of services including unit prices and the amount paid.
- Invoices must be supplied to Horse Sport Ireland in Euros.
 - Mares approved on the Premium Mare Retention Scheme who are based in Northern Ireland and supply an invoice in Sterling, will have that figure paid in Euros.
 - Horse Sport Ireland will not calculate any currency exchanges.
- If videos are not submitted **and/or** the horse is not progressing to a sufficient standard Horse Sport Ireland reserve the right to withhold/refuse payment.



- Applicants may apply for up to two mares and can select a producer of their choosing with experience as per Appendix 3. The nominated producer must produce the mare, not another rider.
- Ownership of the animal cannot be changed between family members for the purpose of entering the scheme.
- Where the breeder of a mare is deceased, but the mare is retained within the breeder's family, they are eligible to apply for this scheme.
- Approved applicants must submit a Tax clearance certificate to HSI as the sum of the grant exceed €5,000 or more. If a tax clearance cert cannot be furnished on request, grants cannot be provided. [CLICK HERE FOR INFORMATION ON HOW TO APPLY.](#)

TERMS AND CONDITIONS – Producer Criteria:

- Applicants must be satisfied as to the skills, knowledge, experience and facilities of their selected producer to care for their horse appropriately and to produce it in an appropriate manner.
 - Producers must be based on the island of Ireland.
 - Producers must not be the owner/close family members of the applicant/breeders/co-owners of the young horse/employees of the applicant or operating from the same premises as the applicant.
 - Nominated producers must produce the horse, no other rider/producer is acceptable.
 - The applicant and producer are responsible for all insurance costs and liability for both horse and producer i.e. to cover any personal accident/injury and or horse accident/injury. Horse Sport Ireland will not be liable for any damages or losses incurred by applicants or producers during the training period.
 - Horse Sport Ireland will not be party to any contracts or agreements entered or between breeders/owners and producers.
 - Horse Sport Ireland will have no role to play in the event of any disputes between breeders/owners and producers arising from participation in this scheme.

Appendix 1. Irish Trotter/Pacer Criteria

- For mares aged between 3-6 years old.
- Mares must be the progeny of Sires that have raced with the following minimum mile rate race time (Pacers: Under 2.00- UK/Ireland, 1.55- USA/Canada/ Southern Hemisphere or have progeny that have won races. Trotters: Mile rate of 1.14 or have progeny that have won races).
- 3–4-year-old pacers must have finished 1st or 2nd in a stakes race or won in a time of 2 minutes and 2 seconds or under.
- 5–6-year-old mares must have won a race in a time of 2 minutes and 1 second or under.
- 3–4-year-old trotters must have been 1st or 2nd in a time of 2 minutes and eight seconds or under (mile rate).
- 4–6-year-old trotters must have won in 2.05 or under (mile rate).
- The dam must have raced and won at least one race.
- Mares qualify for x-ray and embryo transfer scheme in the future.

Trainer/Producer:

- To be selected by the owner of the horse.
- Must be a public trainer licensed with the IHRA.
- The Applicant must also be licensed with the IHRA.

Appendix 2. Pony Performance equivalents

Equivalent pony performance criteria including but not limited to:

- Two own DC/top 10% performance in at an officially recorded class/event as follows:
 - 128A - 1- 1.10m
138A – 1.10m - 1.20m
148A – 1.20m - 1.30m
 - CCIP
 - CCI1*
- Four DC/top 10% performance of the dam/sister (dam line) in at an officially recorded class/event as follows:
 - 128A - 1- 1.10m
138A – 1.10m - 1.20m
148A – 1.20m - 1.30m
 - CCIP
 - CCI1*

Appendix 3. Professional Producer Criteria

Nominated Producing professionals' option must meet one of the following criteria:

- Riders that have qualified a horse for the final in RDS SJ 5-, 6- or 7-year-olds in the last 3 years.
- Riders that have qualified a horse for the final day of any leg in the HSI Studbook Show Jumping Series in the last 3 years.
- Riders that have competed a horse for the final in RDS Young Event Horse class in the last 3 years.
- Riders that have recorded a MER at CCI2*L in the last 3 years.
- Riders that have qualified a horse for the World Breeding Championships for Young horses in Lanaken or Lion d'Angers.
- Riders that have represented a WBFSH member Studbook at the WBFSH Studbooks Jumping Champions Trophy.
- Producer and underage rider combinations that have qualified a pony for the RDS in the last 3 years.
- Have ridden in a nations cup/Olympic qualifier/Olympic class/event.
- Other international experience will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

The onus is on the applicant to provide validated proof of the producer's capacity.
