



Breeding Grant Initiative Unutilized Fund

Applicant Terms and Conditions 2024

- Only shows that are already scheduled/ approved in the affiliate bodies' calendar are eligible for consideration. No new/ unscheduled events will be considered.
- Preference in the first instance, will be given to shows who have not already received funding under this Initiative for 2024
- Date parameters: Shows must be after 1st August but on or before 22nd September to be eligible
- Successful applicants can expect to be allocated no more than a maximum potential of €1,500. Allocations over this amount will be at the exception of the independent panel only.
- Shows who have been awarded funding under this initiative for 2024, can only apply for classes not already funded in 2024.

Allocation of funding is **subject to the approval** of the Breeding Grant Initiative fund from the Department of Agriculture, Food, and the Marine. **This fund cannot support Grand prix Show Jumping events and sport (non-breed/production) focused classes.**

Submission of an application and any subsequent approval maintains that the applicant has provided informed consent to abide by the listed 2024 terms and conditions as set out below:

Funding is only permitted for breed/production initiatives for equines **registered in a studbook** with a breed documented within their studbook passport.

- This can include main section studbook equines **OR** supplementary section studbook equines.

Any breed specific class/prize funded under this scheme must submit a [Derogation to the Department of Agriculture, Food, and the Marine](#), this is a legal requirement. Evidence must be provided to HSI prior to drawdown of funds.

Show Dates

- The final show date must be confirmed to grants@horsesportireland.ie no later than **30 days after** receipt of the success letter.
- Changes to approved show dates, class(es) funded by the Breeding Grant must be submitted in writing to grants@horsesportireland.ie for grant panel evaluation and decision.

Prize funds

- A full breakdown of the prize fund must be submitted to HSI not later than **30 days before the show date.**



- Changes in prize fund breakdowns are not permitted, requested changes must be submitted to HSI in writing for the grant panel evaluation and decision approval.
- Prize winners must be supplied with the **HSI prize form** and submit their full payment details via the online payment form within 14 days of the competition or they will not receive prize money.
 - The horse must be **passported and registered in the correct ownership (SI201/2016)** to be in receipt of any prize fund allocation.
 - All applicants must ensure information provided to Horse Sport Ireland is accurate and up to date.
 - Horse Sport Ireland will not be responsible for unpaid prize monies due to failure by the competitor to submit their online form, equine ineligibility, failure by the show to supply the prize form to the competitor or incorrect prize results submitted to HSI in the show report or any grievances arising between show/event/initiative/class participant and the organiser.
- A show report, of verified results and photographs of the class(es), must be submitted to grants@horsesportireland.ie no later than **three days after the competition** to facilitate an immediate press release and to process prize forms for prize winners in a timely manner. Prize winners **will not** be processed until the above is received from the show.
- A proportion of the prize fund **MUST** be allocated to breeders' prizes. Breeder prizes will only be paid to breeders residing on the Island of Ireland. Information relating to breeder recognition and prizes must be provided to HSI following the event as part of the feedback form.
- Funding will be provided for prize money, prizes in kind, breeders prizes or other relevant breeding initiatives.
 - It is the responsibility of the show/event/initiative/class to engage any additional suppliers as required for the class i.e., promotion, livestream, photography, announcers, judges, etc.
 - All HSI funding allocations are to be used as allocated under the determination of the grant approval panel.
- Horse Sport Ireland are not responsible for any additional funds allocated by the show/event/initiative/class derived from the event or sponsorship. The onus remains with the show to allocate those externally derived funds and for the payment of same.

Breeding Grant Funding: Promotion & Marketing

- Horse Sport Ireland **and** the Department of Agriculture, Food and Marine, must be positively recognised and represented at the event with adequate signage, recognition, digital media, print media and all associated marketing etc.
- A representative from HSI/the wider board may be in attendance and for prize giving.



- If you require a HSI fence at your class/ show, this must be requested 60 days in advance of the relevant show. Failure to request in a timely manner may mean the fence cannot be supplied.
- It is the responsibility of the show to return any Horse Sport Ireland materials (i.e., banners) to the Horse Sport Ireland offices immediately post show. **NOTE: Where HSI materials are not returned, the applicant will incur a replacement charge for said materials.**
- Breeder names for horses competing in HSI funded class(es) should be listed in the start list and show catalogue if possible.

Breeding Grant Funding: Reporting

- Following the event, a feedback report must be completed and returned to HSI with accompanying documentation (results, start list, catalogue, benefit to breeders and industry etc.)
 - Please note that should this fund become available in future the feedback information supplied by shows will be considered when allocating future breeding grant funds.
- If your application is successful, the organising committee will be required to read and sign a Breeding Grant Terms and Conditions document issued via DocuSign.
- Any breed specific class/prize funded under this scheme must submit a [Derogation to the Department of Agriculture, Food, and the Marine](#), this is a legal requirement. Evidence must be provided to HSI prior to drawdown of funds.

Breeding Grant: Eligibility

- Please note that the closing date for receipt of applications is **5pm on Thursday 18th July 2024**. Applications will be deemed to be invalid if they are incomplete or do not contain the relevant supporting documentation.
- Applications will only be accepted via the online application.
- Organisations/ societies submitting more than one application for different events **MUST** submit a post application letter/ email (via grants@horsesportireland.ie), detailing their total funding request for all shows and name each show relevant to the funding.
- Failure to adhere to above terms and conditions may mean that your Breeding Grant funds are reallocated/withheld/removed and will impact future funding applications/requests to Horse Sport Ireland.

- Horse Sport Ireland reserve the right to amend and update these terms and conditions at any time.

Appendix 1: Eligibility Criteria for Applicants

1. Shows/events must be located in Ireland.
2. The applicant must be a legal entity where Horse Sport Ireland retain the right to request audited accounts. Successful applicants may be required to provide a tax clearance certificate.
3. Applicants must complete and return the relevant application form with ALL the requested supporting documentation (see Appendix 3).
4. Applications may be deemed ineligible if they are considered to duplicate initiatives already funded by HSI through National Breeding Services.



5. Applicants may be deemed ineligible if they did not abide by Breeding Grant funding and reporting rules in previous years.
6. All grant funding will be provided in the form of prize money, young horse bursaries or breeding incentives.
7. Applicants must demonstrate how their applications supports the National Breeding Programme.

Appendix 2: Evaluation Criteria for Applicants

Applicants which are applying for funding will be evaluated by the Grant Application Evaluation Committee under the following evaluation criteria:

*Where an applicant has not previously received funding under the Breeding Grant Initiative, adherence will be scored the full allocation based on the assumption that the applicant intends to comply fully with the Breeding Grant funding terms and conditions.
